Passage

Mr. Caire, Minister for Government Digital Transformation, moved that Bill 14, An Act to facilitate the public administration's digital transformation, be adopted.

A debate arose thereon.

At 1.00 o'clock p.m., Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

Accordingly, pursuant to Standing Order 97, the debate on the motion moved by Mr. Caire, Minister for Government Digital Transformation, was adjourned in the name of Mrs. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent).

The proceedings resumed at 3.01 o'clock p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mrs. Montpetit (Maurice-Richard) moved:

THAT the National Assembly solemnly reiterate that achieving greenhouse gas (GHG) emission reduction targets is necessary to combat climate change;

THAT the National Assembly reaffirm Québec's commitment to reducing its GHG emissions from 1990 levels;

THAT it recall that Québec has set up a cap-and-trade system (CATS) for greenhouse gas emission allowances;

THAT it highlight the fact that Québec and California linked their cap-and-trade programs under the Western Climate Initiative in 2014;

THAT it recall the motion unanimously passed last September 25 declaring a climate emergency and asking the Québec Government to use all necessary means to "rapidly and drastically reduce our greenhouse gas emissions";

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly formally request that the CAQ Government not reduce the greenhouse gas emission reduction efforts required of companies under the capand-trade system.

Mrs. Soucy, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for her reply; 53 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 31 minutes 52 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 11 minutes 23 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 10 minutes 15 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to each independent Member. However, if only one independent Member takes part in the debate, that Member's speaking time is 2 minutes. Within this framework, any time not used by independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

At the end of her address, Mrs. Ghazal (Mercier) moved:

THAT the motion moved by the Member for Maurice-Richard be amended as follows:

By adding the following paragraph after the 3rd paragraph: "THAT it recall that exemptions and free emission unit allowances are contrary to the polluter pays principle enshrined in the *Sustainable Development Act* since its passage in 2006;".

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly solemnly reiterate that achieving greenhouse gas (GHG) emission reduction targets is necessary to combat climate change;

THAT the National Assembly reaffirm Québec's commitment to reducing its GHG emissions from 1990 levels;

THAT it recall that Québec has set up a cap-and-trade system (CATS) for greenhouse gas emission allowances;

THAT it recall that exemptions and free emission unit allowances are contrary to the polluter pays principle enshrined in the *Sustainable Development Act* since its passage in 2006;

THAT it highlight the fact that Québec and California linked their cap-and-trade programs under the Western Climate Initiative in 2014;

THAT it recall the motion unanimously passed last September 25 declaring a climate emergency and asking the Québec Government to use all necessary means to "rapidly and drastically reduce our greenhouse gas emissions";

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly formally request that the CAQ Government not reduce the greenhouse gas emission reduction efforts required of companies under the capand-trade system.

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Mrs. Montpetit (Maurice-Richard) and on the amendment motion moved by Mrs. Ghazal (Mercier), subject to the permission of its author.

At the end of his intervention, Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière) moved:

THAT the motion moved by the Member for Maurice-Richard be amended as follows:

By adding the following at the end of the last paragraph: "and that it prepare a carbon budget specifying the maximum quantity of greenhouse gases that may be emitted for the whole of Québec in the coming year".

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly solemnly reiterate that achieving greenhouse gas (GHG) emission reduction targets is necessary to combat climate change;

THAT the National Assembly reaffirm Québec's commitment to reducing its GHG emissions from 1990 levels;

THAT it recall that Québec has set up a cap-and-trade system (CATS) for greenhouse gas emission allowances;

THAT it highlight the fact that Québec and California linked their cap-and-trade programs under the *Western Climate Initiative* in 2014;

THAT it recall the motion unanimously passed last September 25 declaring a climate emergency and asking the Québec Government to use all necessary means to "rapidly and drastically reduce our greenhouse gas emissions"; THAT, lastly, the National Assembly formally request that the CAQ Government not reduce the greenhouse gas emission reduction efforts required of companies under the capand-trade system and that it prepare a carbon budget specifying the maximum quantity of greenhouse gases that may be emitted for the whole of Québec in the coming year.

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Mrs. Montpetit (Maurice-Richard) and on the amendment motions moved by Mrs. Ghazal (Mercier) and Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière), subject to the permission of its author.

Pursuant to Standing Order 98.1, Mrs. Montpetit (Maurice-Richard) refused the amendment proposed by Mrs. Ghazal (Mercier) and accepted the amendment proposed by Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière).

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, the divisions on the amendment motion moved by Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière) and on the motion moved by Mrs. Montpetit (Maurice-Richard) were deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Government Bills

Passage

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned earlier in the sitting, on the motion moved by Mr. Caire, Minister for Government Digital Transformation, for the passage of Bill 14, An Act to facilitate the public administration's digital transformation.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried on division and, accordingly, Bill 14 was passed.

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 1 October 2019, on the motion moved by Mr. Julien, Minister of Energy and Natural Resources, that Bill 34, An Act to simplify the process for establishing electricity distribution rates, do now pass in principle.

The debate was adjourned in the name of Mrs. Weil (Notre-Dame-de-Grâce).

At 6.00 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Thursday, 3 October 2019 at 9.40 o'clock a.m.
