The Assembly was called to order at 9.40 o'clock a.m.

ROUTINE PROCEEDINGS

Statements by Members

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 30 October 2019, on the motion moved by Mrs. Ghazal (Mercier) and on the amendment motion moved by Mrs. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent) during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

First, the question was put on the amendment motion moved by Mrs. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the motion moved by the Member for Mercier be amended as follows:

By adding ", as well as all those it deems necessary to convene" after the word "organizations" at the end of the 11th line.

The amendment motion was negatived on the following vote:

The question was then put on the motion moved by Mrs. Ghazal (Mercier).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT, within the framework of the consideration of Bill 197, An Act to amend the Consumer Protection Act to fight planned obsolescence and assert the right to repair goods, the Committee on Citizen Relations hold special consultations and public hearings on Tuesday, 21 January 2020, from 9.30 o'clock a.m. to 12.00 o'clock noon and from 2.00 o'clock p.m. to 5.45 o'clock p.m.; and on Wednesday, 22 January 2020, from 9.30 o'clock a.m. to 12.30 o'clock p.m. and from 2.00 o'clock p.m. to 5.45 o'clock p.m.;

THAT, for this purpose, the Committee hear the following individuals and organizations:

Institut de l'environnement, du développement durable et de l'économie circulaire Office de protection du consommateur Mr. Jonathan Mayer, Lecturer, Université de Sherbrooke (initiator of Bill 197) and/or the Faculty of Law of that university Mr. Martin Masse, founder of the company Zone Accro Mrs. Agnès Beaulieu of Insertec Angus AmiEs de la terre de Québec Recyc-Québec Front québécois pour la gestion écologique des déchets Association québécoise Zéro déchet du Québec Bureau de normalisation du Québec Chantier de l'économie sociale; THAT a period of 12 minutes be set aside for opening statements, allocated as follows: 5 minutes 34 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government, 3 minutes 43 seconds to the Official Opposition, 56 seconds to the Second Opposition Group, 56 seconds to the Third Opposition Group and, lastly, 51 seconds to the Member for Chomedey;

THAT the presentation by each individual or organization last no longer than 10 minutes and the exchange with the Committee members last no longer than 35 minutes, allocated as follows: 16 minutes 15 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government, 10 minutes 50 seconds to the Official Opposition, 2 minutes 43 seconds to the Second Opposition Group, 2 minutes 43 seconds to the Third Opposition Group and 2 minutes 30 seconds to the Member for Chomedey;

THAT the organization of proceedings be entrusted to the Committee's steering committee, including the preparation of the schedule according to any request for changes made by individuals and organizations;

THAT the Member for Chomedey be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference;

THAT the Minister of Justice be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Charest, Minister Responsible for the Status of Women, together with Mrs. David (Marguerite-Bourgeoys), Mrs. Labrie (Sherbrooke), Ms. Perry Mélançon (Gaspé), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 40th anniversary of the Secrétariat à la condition féminine;

THAT it applaud the many initiatives put in place or supported by the Secrétariat à la condition féminine to prevent and counter sexual and domestic violence and to promote gender equality;

THAT it raise awareness among Quebecers of the inequalities that women still face in Québec and around the world;

THAT it recognize the remarkable work done by women's organizations and groups;

THAT, lastly, the Members of the National Assembly work together to make Québec an ever more egalitarian society.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

The President heard arguments from all sides on the point of privilege or contempt raised by Mr. Ouellet, House Leader of the Third Opposition Group, on 29 October 2019.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 53 and 59, Mr. Tanguay, Official Opposition House Leader, tabled the following:

A press release, dated 29 October 2019, from Hydro-Québec on the erroneous information disseminated by the Canadian Federation of Independent Business, entitled "Des informations erronées véhiculées par la Fédération canadienne des entreprises indépendantes".

The President took the matter under advisement.

Mrs. Soucy, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Friday, 8 November 2019, Mr. Polo (Laval-des-Rapides) would question Mr. Julien, Minister of Energy and Natural Resources, during an interpellation on the lack of reimbursement to Québec consumers of amounts overbilled promised by the Coalition Avenir Québec and the weakening of the Régie de l'énergie.

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mrs. McCann, Minister of Health and Social Services, moved that Bill 31, An Act to amend mainly the Pharmacy Act to facilitate access to certain services, do now pass in principle.

A debate arose thereon.

At 12.59 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Soucy, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.01 o'clock p.m.

Passage in Principle

The Assembly continued the debate on the motion moved by Mrs. McCann, Minister of Health and Social Services, that Bill 31, An Act to amend mainly the Pharmacy Act to facilitate access to certain services, do now pass in principle.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried, and Bill 31 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 31 be referred to the Committee on Health and Social Services for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

Passage

Mrs. McCann, Minister of Health and Social Services, moved the passage of Bill 28, An Act to allow the establishment of certain health and social services measures related to the Mauricie et Centre-du-Québec health region's special geographic status.

After a debate thereon, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 30 October 2019, on the motion moved by Mr. Roberge, Minister of Education and Higher Education, for the passage of Bill 5, An Act to amend the Education Act and other provisions regarding preschool education services for students 4 years of age.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

At the request of Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, the division was deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Public Finance on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 36, An Act to amend the Companies Act concerning participation in and decision making at meetings of legal persons without share capital.

After a debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

At 4.17 o'clock p.m., at the request of Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 6.00 o'clock p.m.

Debates upon Adjournment

At 6.00 o'clock p.m., the Assembly held three debates upon adjournment:

— the first, on a question from Mr. Barrette (La Pinière) to Mr. Dubé, Minister Responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, about the implementation of new patient-to-nurse ratios in Québec. Mrs. McCann, Minister of Health and Social Services, replaced the Minister for this debate;

- the second, on a question from Mr. Derraji (Nelligan) to Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister of Immigration, Francization and Integration, about the projected immigration thresholds for 2020 in relation with the severe labour shortage. Mrs. Guilbault, Deputy Premier, replaced the Minister for this debate;
- the third, on a question from Mr. Polo (Laval-des-Rapides) to Mr. Julien, Minister of Energy and Natural Resources, about electricity rates and Bill 34, An Act to simplify the process for establishing electricity distribution rates.

At 6.39 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Tuesday, 5 November 2019 at 1.40 o'clock p.m.
