Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 31 October 2019, on the motion moved by Mrs. McCann, Minister of Health and Social Services, for the passage of Bill 28, An Act to allow the establishment of certain health and social services measures related to the Mauricie et Centre-du-Québec health region's special geographic status.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Ghazal (Mercier), together with Mr. Polo (Laval-des-Rapides), Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière) and Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), moved:

THAT the National Assembly note that, through Bill 44, the Minister of the Environment and the Fight Against Climate Change is appropriating new powers;

THAT it recall that the Green Fund has been used in the past to subsidize Énergir company projects aimed at expanding the natural gas distribution network;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government, should Bill 44 pass, to make a formal commitment not to subsidize the GNL Québec project with the sums planned for the Electrification and Climate Change Fund.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Blais, Minister Responsible for Seniors and Informal Caregivers, together with Mrs. Sauvé (Fabre), Mrs. Dorion (Taschereau), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), moved:

THAT the National Assembly underline the daily commitment of informal caregivers of all ages, whether they are the spouse, child, brother or sister and no matter what the setting;

THAT it recognize that the accompaniment offered by informal caregivers to their loved ones is often to the detriment of their health and financial situation;

THAT it note that investment and effort must be made to give new meaning to their devotion;

THAT, to this end, it ask the Government to continue to invest while taking into account the needs of all caregivers in Québec;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly underline the National Caregivers Week, which will be held on 3 to 9 November 2019 under the theme "I sow kindness".

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

THAT the Minister of Health and Social Services be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 6 November 2019, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mr. Derraji (Nelligan).

The motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly recall that the Programme de l'expérience québécoise (PEQ – Québec experience program) is a fast track for obtaining a Québec selection certificate, which is a prerequisite to obtaining permanent residence;

THAT it acknowledge that, in 2018, the program enabled 11,000 temporary foreign workers and foreign graduates of Québec educational institutions to immigrate to Québec;

THAT it note that the changes made to the Québec experience program by the CAQ Government tarnish Québec's international reputation, undermine its ability to attract and retain the talent needed for Québec's economic growth and have a dramatic impact on the immigration plans of thousands of foreign students and temporary foreign workers currently in Québec;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly demand that the CAQ Government cancel the recent changes to the program and reinstate the eligibility criteria in place before the moratorium imposed last July.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage

Mr. Girard, Minister of Finance, moved the passage of Bill 36, An Act to amend the Companies Act concerning participation in and decision making at meetings of legal persons without share capital.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 36 was passed.

Passage in Principle

Mr. Dubé, Minister Responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, informed the Assembly that the Honourable J. Michel Doyon, Lieutenant-Governor of Québec, recommended Bill 37, An Act mainly to establish the Centre d'acquisitions gouvernementales and Infrastructures technologiques Québec, for its consideration, and then moved that this bill do now pass in principle.

A debate arose thereon.

- the first, on a question from Mr. Derraji (Nelligan) to Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister of Immigration, Francization and Integration, about the human impact of the announced changes to the Programme de l'expérience québécoise (PEQ Québec experience program);
- the second, on a question from Mr. Leitão (Robert-Baldwin) to Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister of Immigration, Francization and Integration, about the human impact of the CAQ Government's decisions concerning the announced changes to the Programme de l'expérience québécoise (PEQ Québec experience program).

At 6.29 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Soucy, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 7.30 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 7.30 o'clock p.m.
Passage in Principle
The Assembly resumed the debate on the motion moved by Mr. Dubé, Minister Responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, that Bill 37, An Act mainly to establish the Centre d'acquisitions gouvernementales and Infrastructures technologiques Québec, do now pass in principle.
The debate being concluded, the motion was carried on division, and Bill 37 was accordingly passed in principle.
Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 37 be referred to the Committee on Public Finance for clause-by-clause consideration.

Passage in Principle
Mrs. LeBel, Minister of Justice, moved the passage in principle of Bill 32, An Act mainly to promote the efficiency of penal justice and to establish the terms governing the intervention of the Court of Québec with respect to applications for appeal.
A debate arose thereon.

At 9.30 o'clock p.m., Mrs. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Wednesday, 6 November 2019 at 9.40 o'clock a.m.
