

## **Business Having Precedence**

Debate on the Budget Speech

The Assembly resumed the debate on the motion by Mr. Landry, Minister of Finance, —That the Assembly approves in general the budgetary policy of the Government, and on the want of confidence motions moved by Mrs. Jérôme-Forget (Marguerite-Bourgeoys), Mr. Gautrin (Verdun) and Mr. Dumont (Rivière-du-Loup).

At the end of his speech, Mr. Williams (Nelligan) moved the following want of confidence motion:

That the National Assembly severely blame the Parti Québécois Government for its failure to act, particularly regarding support measures to facilitate services and care to disabled persons, as well as for its lack of leadership with regard to young people experiencing problems.

And debate continuing on the motion by Mr. Landry, Minister of Finance, and on the want of confidence motions moved by Mrs. Jérôme-Forget (Marguerite-Bourgeoys), Mr. Gautrin (Verdun), Mr. Dumont (Rivière-du-Loup) and Mr. Williams (Nelligan);

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 20, the proceedings continued beyond 12.00 o=clock p.m.

## **Debates Upon Adjournment**

The Assembly held four debates upon adjournment:

 the first, pursuant to the order adopted on Thursday, 11 March 1999, on a question by Mr. Sirros (Laurier-Dorion) to Mrs. Harel, Minister of State for Municipal Affairs and Greater Montréal, about the municipal taxation agreement;

Before the debate began, Mr. Paradis, Official Opposition House Leader, requested that Mr. Bissonnet, Vice-President, give a directive on the following questions: 1) Can a Minister be replaced in a debate upon adjournment; 2) Can the Chair influence the Government House Leader to play a role in this matter; 3) Is it possible to raise a point of order during an end of sitting debate?

Mr. Bissonnet, Vice-President, gave the following directive with regard to the first aspect of the request:

### DIRECTIVE FROM THE CHAIR

As regards a debate upon adjournment, it is ultimately the Government that decides which Minister will participate in the debate. The Chair has no authority with respect to which Minister will represent the Government.

Mr. Bissonnet, Vice-President, took the two remaining aspects of the request under advisement.

At the request of Mr. Bissonnet, Vice-President, Mr. Paradis, Official Opposition House Leader, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

The Assembly held the debate on a question by Mr. Sirros (Laurier-Dorion) to Mr. Brassard, Government House Leader, on behalf of Mrs. Harel, Minister of State for Municipal Affairs and Greater Montréal, about the municipal taxation agreement.

The Assembly then held the remaining debates upon adjournment:

- the second, on a question by Mr. Sirros (Laurier-Dorion) to Mr. Perreault, Minister of Relations with the Citizens and Immigration, on behalf of Mrs. Harel, Minister of State for Municipal Affairs and Greater Montréal, about Montréal-International;
- the third, on a question addressed last Wednesday, 17 March 1999, by Mrs. Houda-Pepin (La Pinière) to Mr. J. Baril, Minister for Transport, on behalf of Mr. G. Baril, Minister for Health, Social Services and Youth Protection, about certain Montérégie youth centres;
- the fourth, on a question by Mr. Poulin (Beauce-Nord) to Mr. Brassard, Government House Leader, on behalf of Mr. Julien, Minister for Industry and Trade, about the abolishment of the small businesses deduction.

At 6.56 o'clock p.m., Mr. Bissonnet, Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Tuesday, 23 March 1999, at 10.00 o'clock a.m.
