#### **Motions Without Notice**

Mr. Ouellet (René-Lévesque), together with Mr. Barrette (La Pinière), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on the construction of a bridge between Tadoussac and Baie-Sainte-Catherine; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Roy, Minister of Culture and Communications, together with Mrs. Melançon (Verdun), Mrs. Dorion (Taschereau), Mr. Bérubé, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec pay tribute to recently deceased Mr. Joseph Rouleau, one of the most influential figures in opera in Québec;

THAT it highlight his exceptional international career over the course of which he performed on the world's most prestigious stages, including London's Royal Opera House where he performed over 1,000 times;

THAT it acknowledge the instrumental role he played in Québec classical music by, among other things, founding the Atelier lyrique de l'Université du Québec à Montréal and the Mouvement d'action pour l'art lyrique du Québec, by contributing to the creation of the Opéra de Montréal and by acting as Chair of the Board of Jeunesses musicales Canada for more than 25 years;

THAT it recall that Mr. Rouleau was a Grand Officer of the Ordre national du Québec, a Companion of the Order of Canada, a Commander of the Ordre de Montréal and a member of the Canadian Opera Hall of Fame;

THAT it convey its condolences to his family, friends, colleagues and many admirers throughout Québec;

THAT, lastly, it observe a moment of reflection in his memory.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

THAT the National Assembly applaud the Minister of Labour, Employment and Social Solidarity's commitment to reforming the *Act respecting occupational health and safety*, as attested by the motion dated 2 October 2019, which was unanimously carried;

THAT it recall that only 26.1% of workers are protected under the prevention mechanisms provided for in the *Act respecting occupational health and safety*;

THAT the National Assembly demand that the Minister of Labour, Employment and Social Solidarity's bill provide that all labour sectors be covered by prevention mechanisms.
