#### **Deferred Divisions**

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 27 November 2019, on the motion moved by Mr. Roberge, Minister of Education and Higher Education, that Bill 40, An Act to amend mainly the Education Act with regard to school organization and governance, pass in principle.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Yeas: 66 Nays: 44 Abstentions: 0

Accordingly, Bill 40 was passed in principle.

Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 40 be referred to the Committee on Culture and Education for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried on division.

#### **Motions Without Notice**

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Melançon (Verdun), together with Mrs. Roy, Minister of Culture and Communications, Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), Mrs. Perry Mélançon (Gaspé), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

Given that the survival of the Soleil, Quotidien, Droit, Nouvelliste, Tribune and Voix de l'Est newspapers is threatened;

Given that these media companies employ 350 people;

Given that Quebecers are entitled to obtain quality local and regional information;

Given that, on 19 November 2019, the Minister of Economy and Innovation announced his preference for a cooperative model to ensure the continuity of these media companies;

Given that Desjardins announced, on the same day, that it would not be participating in the financing package;

Given that Desjardins wishes to re-evaluate its refusal to finance the cooperative project of the Groupe Capitales Médias employees;

Given that the financial package related to the recovery plan remains uncertain;

Given that only three weeks remain to come up with a financing agreement, failing which it will mean the end for these newspapers;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government to take any and all steps necessary to ensure the viability of the Groupe Capitales Médias employees' cooperative project.

The question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Mrs. Massé, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, together with Mr. Arcand, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on respecting the principles of the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière), together with Mr. Barrette (La Pinière), Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on the agreement in principle on medical specialists' remuneration; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Roy, Minister of Culture and Communications, together with Mrs. Melançon (Verdun), Mrs. Dorion (Taschereau), Mrs. Perry Mélançon (Gaspé), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly of Québec pay tribute to recently deceased Ms. Andrée Lachapelle, one of the most influential figures in Québec theatre, television and film;

THAT it underline her outstanding career spanning almost 70 years, during which she interpreted dozens of roles that left an indelible mark on our collective imagination;

THAT it underscore her major contribution to Québec's cultural landscape;

THAT it recall that Ms. Lachapelle was a Knight of the Ordre national du Québec and an Officer of the Order of Canada;

THAT it convey its sincere condolences to her family, her friends and her peers, and to her many admirers throughout Ouébec;

THAT, lastly, it observe a moment of silence in her memory.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.
