THAT the National Assembly reaffirm the paramount importance of freedom of expression in any democratic society;

THAT it recognize the right of all of those involved in the education field, including school administrators, to publicly give their opinion on Bill 40, An Act to amend mainly the Education Act with regard to school organization and governance;

THAT it encourage school administrators and all stakeholders in the network to denounce any pressure deemed undue and aimed at undermining their right to freely express their opinion on the legislative modifications provided for in Bill 40.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mrs. Massé, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, together with Mrs. Montpetit (Maurice-Richard), Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Mrs. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly remind the CAQ Government that Québec officially declared a climate emergency on 25 September 2019;

THAT it recall that the motion passed unanimously asked the Québec Government "to bring all of its political choices into line with this emergency situation";

THAT it recall that the role of the Premier of Québec is to defend the values of Quebecers and the consensus of the National Assembly;

THAT the National Assembly urge the Premier to put the fight against climate change at the heart of his discussions with his counterparts from other Canadian provinces and with the Prime Minister of Canada.

THAT the National Assembly recognize Gaspésie–Îles-de-la-Madeleine as an administrative region with significant differences:

THAT it underscore the fact that these differences result in major challenges, particularly in view of the region's size, remoteness and the insular reality of the Magdalen Islands; THAT it recognize that, in recent years, the Gaspésie—Îles-de-la-Madeleine region has fallen significantly behind with respect to public funding in health, transportation, education and culture;

THAT it recall that this situation has had a far-reaching impact on the region's economic development and its ability to establish its own institutions in many areas of Québec jurisdiction;

THAT, lastly, it emphasize the importance of supporting the Gaspésie-Îles-de-la-Madeleine region, including by taking into consideration these significant differences.
