Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 12 February 2020, on the motion moved by Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve) and on the amendment motion moved by Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

First, the question was put on the amendment motion moved by Mr. LeBel (Rimouski).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the motion moved by Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve) be amended as follows:

By adding the following paragraph at the end:

"a ban on using a dwelling for the sole purpose of collaborative tourist accommodation (of the Airbnb type) throughout Québec."

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

The question was then put on the motion moved by Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government to introduce, no later than June 2020, an emergency bill to deal with the housing crisis currently prevailing in Québec;

THAT the bill include:

a moratorium on lessee evictions under article 1959 of the Civil Code in sectors where the rental property vacancy rate is less than 3%; a rent increase rate maximum.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Nadeau-Dubois, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Government House Leader, Mr. Tanguay, Official Opposition House Leader, Mr. Ouellet, House Leader of the Third Opposition Group, Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly affirm the importance of carrying out a parliamentary reform to modernize parliamentary procedure and the Standing Orders governing Members' parliamentary work;

THAT it acknowledge the need for such a reform to be carried out in a transpartisan manner and in a spirit of cooperation and for it to be unanimously adopted;

THAT it underline that, as the guardian of the rights of all the Members and chief non-partisan representative of the institution, the President of the National Assembly must play a central role in the reform process.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 145, Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Public Finance, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 23, An Act respecting the names and responsibilities of certain ministers and government departments and to enact the Act respecting the Ministère des Forêts, de la Faune et des Parcs;

ORDERS OF THE DAY

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Lamontagne, Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, moved that Bill 48, An Act mainly to control the cost of the farm property tax and to simplify access to the farm property tax credit, do now pass in principle.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried and Bill 48 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 48 be referred to the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 12 February 2020, on the motion moved by Mr. Charette, Minister of the Environment and the Fight Against Climate Change, that Bill 44, An Act mainly to ensure effective governance of the fight against climate change and to promote electrification, do now pass in principle.

At 1.00 o'clock p.m., Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 3.00 o'clock p.m.

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned earlier in the sitting, on the motion moved by Mr. Charette, Minister of the Environment and the Fight Against Climate Change, that Bill 44, An Act mainly to ensure effective governance of the fight against climate change and to promote electrification, do now pass in principle.

At the end of his address, Mr. Polo (Laval-des-Rapides) moved the following motion to divide the said Bill:

THAT, pursuant to Standing Order 241, Bill 44, An Act mainly to ensure effective governance of the fight against climate change and to promote electrification, be divided into two bills, the first of which shall be entitled "An Act mainly to ensure effective governance of the Green Fund and effectively fight climate change", and shall comprise sections 1 to 42 and 77; and the second of which shall be entitled "An Act to change the governance of the energy transition", and shall comprise sections 43 to 76 and 77.

At 4.38 o'clock p.m., Ms. Soucy, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for a few minutes.

The proceedings resumed at 4.49 o'clock p.m.

At 5.01 o'clock p.m., after hearing arguments from all sides regarding the receivability of the motion to divide, Ms. Soucy, Second Vice-President, took the matter under advisement and suspended the proceedings.

The proceedings resumed at 5.37 o'clock p.m.

Ms. Soucy, Second Vice-President, ruled on the receivability of the motion to divide moved by Mr. Polo (Laval-des-Rapides).

RULING FROM THE CHAIR

Parliamentary jurisprudence has recognized that, for a motion to divide to be declared receivable, a bill must contain more than one principle and each bill resulting from the division must be coherent, complete and able to stand alone.

The Chair has also mentioned on numerous occasions that analysis of a motion to divide's receivability should not be based on the bill's author's purpose, but should consider the bill's provisions to determine whether the bill contains more than one principle.

In light of these criteria, and having read and analyzed the bill's provisions, the Chair has ascertained the existence of more than one principle in the bill. It is not because principles may be grouped under a single theme that they are to be considered simply terms of a broader principle.

Once it has been determined that a bill contains more than one principle, the Chair must determine if the way the sections are divided among the different bills resulting from the division generates separate bills that are coherent and can be considered independently.

The motion to divide proposes that the bill be divided in two bills: the first, a bill to ensure the effective governance of the Green Fund and effectively fight climate change, and the second, a bill to change the governance of the energy transition.

The Chair notes that both bills resulting from the division are coherent, complete and able to stand alone.

Given the aforementioned, the Chair concludes that the motion to divide meets the criteria established by jurisprudence.

Consequently, the motion to divide is declared receivable.

Ms. Soucy, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for this limited debate: 58 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 34 minutes 51 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 12 minutes 27 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 11 minutes 12 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to each independent Member. However, if only one independent Member takes part in the debate, that Member's speaking time is 2 minutes. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate was adjourned in the name of Mr. Charette, Minister of the Environment and the Fight Against Climate Change.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 53, the Assembly took Notices of Proceedings in Committees.

Mr. Caire, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committee:

At 6.00 o'clock p.m., the Assembly held three debates upon adjournment:

— the first, on a question from Mr. Derraji (Nelligan) to Mr. Fitzgibbon, Minister of Economy and Innovation, about the impact of the labour shortage on Québec companies. Mr. Caire, Minister for Government Digital Transformation, replaced the Minister for this debate;

- the second, on a question from Mr. Fortin (Pontiac) to Ms. McCann, Minister of Health and Social Services, about the CIUSSS Mauricie-Centre-du-Québec's firing of a whistleblower;
- the third, on a question from Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil) to Mr. Bonnardel, Minister of Transport, about the impact of the railway blockade on Québec companies and their supply. Mr. Caire, Minister for Government Digital Transformation, replaced the Minister for this debate.

At 6.41 o'clock p.m., Ms. Soucy, Second Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Tuesday, 18 February 2020 at 1.40 o'clock p.m.
