Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Dorion (Taschereau), together with Ms. Blais, Minister Responsible for Seniors and Informal Caregivers, Mr. Fortin (Pontiac), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly deplore the fact that it was necessary to call on the Canadian Armed Forces to provide services in Québec CHSLDs in the context of the pandemic;

THAT it take note of the report unveiled yesterday by the Canadian Armed Forces, which sheds light on the catastrophic situation in Ontario's long-term care facilities;

THAT it affirm that any report containing information on the living conditions of seniors in long-term care facilities, regardless of its author, is in the public interest, in particular in order to prepare the health and social services network for a potential second wave of COVID-19 in the coming months;

THAT it take note of the information reported in the media, that the Québec Government received a report from the Canadian Armed Forces on the situation in Québec's long-term care facilities yesterday evening;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Québec Government to make the entire report public as of today.

The question was put on this motion; in accordance with the motion carried on 13 May 2020, the votes of the House leaders and independent Members were recorded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Mr. Ouellet, House Leader of the Third Opposition Group, together with Mr. Barrette (La Pinière), Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on a plan to loosen quarantine measures; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Dubé, Minister Responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, together with Mr. Barrette (La Pinière), Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge the relevance and necessity, in the current economic context, of accelerating investments in infrastructure projects, especially projects relating to transportation, health and education, without weakening environmental protections or respect for workers' rights;

THAT it recognize that a robust recovery of the economy and the construction industry requires an acceleration of those investments, which would allow Québec to be equipped with both modern and quality infrastructures;

THAT it recall that project planning rules constitute important steps in the carrying out of infrastructure projects;

THAT it ask the Government to continue and intensify its efforts to carry out as many projects as possible in the next few years, while maintaining the quality of tendering and price control processes;

THAT, lastly, it ask the Government to carry out the infrastructure projects in compliance with the costs announced in the last QIP.

The question was put on this motion; in accordance with the motion carried on 13 May 2020, the votes of the House leaders and independent Members were recorded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), together with Ms. Labrie (Sherbrooke), Ms. Perry Mélançon (Gaspé), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on reopening day camps; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

At 11.14 o'clock a.m., the President suspended the proceedings for a few minutes.

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ORDERS OF THE DAY

Debates on Reports from Committees

In accordance with the motion carried on 13 May 2020, the Assembly entered upon the two-hour limited debate on the estimates of expenditure for the fiscal year ending on 31 March 2021, which debate is considered a debate on a report from a committee and is to be held no later than 12 June 2020.

Ms. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 58 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 34 minutes 51 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 12 minutes 27 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Second Opposition Group; 11 minutes 12 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to the independent Members. However, if only one independent Member takes part in the debate, that Member's speaking time is 2 minutes. Within this framework, any time not used by an independent Member or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

At 1.00 o'clock p.m., Ms. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 3.00 o'clock p.m.

Accordingly, pursuant to Standing Order 97, the limited two-hour debate on the estimates of expenditure for the fiscal year ending on 31 March 2021 was adjourned.

The proceedings resumed at 3.01 o'clock p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent) moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that the confinement due to the COVID-19 pandemic has had a profound impact on the daily lives of Québec students;

THAT it acknowledge that the continuation of schooling and educational activities through remote means was carried out unevenly and that not all students received the same level of services;

THAT it acknowledge that the most vulnerable students may fall behind considerably and lose some of their educational gains;

THAT it recall that, according to many experts, anxiety levels have risen significantly among Québec's young people;

THAT it ask the Québec Government to provide Québec students with access to support services, such as psychological, speech therapy and special education services, throughout the summer in preparation for the beginning of the 2020–2021 school year, and that those services be offered on a continuing basis from now on;

THAT, lastly, it ask the Québec Government to establish a voluntary three-week upgrading period for all students, giving priority to students graduating from the elementary level to the secondary level and from the secondary level to the college level, so that they are able to fully acquire the learning likely to promote their school success and ensure a better transition. Ms. Soucy, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for her reply; 53 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 31 minutes 52 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 11 minutes 23 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 10 minutes 15 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to each independent Member. However, if only one independent Member takes part in the debate, that Member's speaking time is 2 minutes. Within this framework, any time not used by an independent Member or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

At the end of her address, Ms. Hivon (Joliette) moved:

THAT the motion moved by Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent) be amended as follows:

By replacing the fifth paragraph by the following paragraphs:

"THAT it ask the Québec Government to provide all students who need it with access to support services, particularly in psychology, speech therapy and special needs education, and that it do so immediately, through the summer and when the 2020–2021 school resumes in the fall;

THAT it ask that the Québec Government offer these services in a continuing fashion, starting immediately, to more students and with greater intensity, and that the funding required to ensure access to these services be freed up;

THAT it ask the Québec Government to provide to all students requiring them, and free of charge, the technological tools necessary to continue online distance education;" The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that the confinement due to the COVID-19 pandemic has had a profound impact on the daily lives of Québec students;

THAT it acknowledge that the continuation of schooling and educational activities through remote means was carried out unevenly and that not all students received the same level of services;

THAT it acknowledge that the most vulnerable students may fall behind considerably and lose some of their educational gains;

THAT it recall that, according to many experts, anxiety levels have risen significantly among Québec's young people;

THAT it ask the Québec Government to provide all students who need it with access to support services, particularly in psychology, speech therapy and special needs education, and that it do so immediately, through the summer and when the 2020–2021 school resumes in the fall;

THAT it ask the Québec Government to provide to all students requiring them, and free of charge, the technological tools necessary to continue online distance education;

THAT, lastly, it ask the Québec Government to establish a voluntary three-week upgrading period for all students, giving priority to students graduating from the elementary level to the secondary level and from the secondary level to the college level, so that they are able to fully acquire the learning likely to promote their school success and ensure a better transition. The debate continued on the main motion moved by Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent) and on the amendment motion moved by Ms. Hivon (Joliette), subject to the permission of its author.

Pursuant to Standing Order 98.1, Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent) accepted the amendment proposed by Ms. Hivon (Joliette).

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the amendment motion; in accordance with the motion carried on 13 May 2020, the votes of the House leaders and independent Members were recorded.

The amendment motion was carried on the following vote:

The debate expired and, in accordance with the motion carried on 13 May 2020, no question was put before the Assembly.

At 5.39 o'clock p.m., Ms. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 6.00 o'clock p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 6.00 o'clock p.m.

Debates upon Adjournment

At 6.00 o'clock p.m., in accordance with the motion carried on 13 May 2020, the Assembly held three debates upon adjournment:

- the first, on a question from Mr. Fortin (Pontiac) to Ms. McCann, Minister of Health and Social Services, about the CAQ Government's poor management of the air-conditioning issue in CHSLDs. Ms. Blais, Minister Responsible for Seniors and Informal Caregivers, replaced the Minister for this debate;
- the second, on a question from Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil) to Ms. Laforest, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing, about emergency funding needs for Québec day camps;

— the third, on a question from Mr. Benjamin (Viau) to Ms. Proulx, Minister of Tourism, about the absence of a plan to support and revive the tourism industry. Ms. Roy, Minister of Culture and Communications, replaced the Minister for this debate.

At 6.38 o'clock p.m., Ms. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, adjourned the Assembly until Thursday, 28 May 2020 at 9.40 o'clock a.m.
