Whereas on 17 October 2017 the National Assembly appointed Mr. Jean-François Routhier Lobbyists Commissioner and determined his conditions of employment;

Whereas the function of Lobbyists Commissioner has been modified by the *Act to transfer responsibility for the registry of lobbyists to the Lobbyists Commissioner and to implement the Charbonneau Commission recommendation on the prescription period for bringing penal proceedings (2019, chapter 13);*

Whereas it is appropriate to modify the level of employment and annual salary of Mr. Jean-François Routhier, Lobbyists Commissioner;

Accordingly, after consultation with the Opposition parties and the independent Members, Mr. Legault, Premier, moved:

THAT the level of employment and annual salary of Mr. Jean-François Routhier, Lobbyists Commissioner, be modified;

THAT the new conditions of employment of Mr. Jean-François Routhier as Lobbyists Commissioner be those tabled in the Appendix, effective immediately.
