Tyrosinemia Type I is a common hereditary disease in Québec. It is characterized by the liver's inability to produce an enzyme required to metabolize an amino acid found in several animal and plant proteins called tyrosine,

In order to allow children to live with the disease, they are given a medication combined with a diet that is highly protein restricted. However, for many patients, this treatment results in a significant decrease in the level of another essential amino acid called phenylalanine. This deficit can lead to delays in cognitive development. In order to counter these delays, it is recommended to take a phenylalanine supplement.

As Ms. Sophie Taillon indicated in the June 25th edition of *Le Quotidien*, the cost of this supplement is a major obstacle. For the parents of a child with tyrosinemia, the cost is over \$100 a month. Some families cannot afford this amount for one or more children. Since phenylalanine is not considered a drug or a dietary supplement, some private insurance companies and Québec's Public Prescription Drug Insurance Plan do not cover it. Efforts to obtain exceptional recognition have been unsuccessful, for both the drug and patients.

For several years, the Hereditary Tyrosinemia Group and medical teams have been making the Ministère de la Santé aware of this reality and requesting reimbursement of the cost of the phenylalanine supplement used to treat tyrosinemic patients. So far, no response has been provided by the Minister of Health.

My question is as follows:

- When will the Government live up to its reputation as a world leader with respect to tyrosinemia treatments by making phenylalanine accessible to all patients through Québec's Public Prescription Drug Insurance Plan?
