Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister Responsible for the French Language, together with Ms. David (Marguerite-Bourgeoys), Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), Mr. Bérubé, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly reiterate that French is the only official language of Québec;

THAT the National Assembly reiterate that the French language allows Quebecers to express their identity;

THAT the National Assembly reiterate that the French language is the official language of the State and communications in Québec;

THAT the National Assembly assert the duty of the elected Members of the Québec nation to promote, develop and defend the use of the French language;

THAT the National Assembly recall that its Members should make their statements in French when addressing the Québec Parliamentary Press Gallery, as is the custom and tradition, except for safety and public health reasons.

The question was put on this motion; in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 15 September 2020, a vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Kelley (Jacques-Cartier), together with Ms. D'Amours, Minister Responsible for Indigenous Affairs, Ms. Massé, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Bérubé, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

> THAT the National Assembly mark the National Day to Commemorate Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, held on 4 October;

> THAT it underscore that, one year ago, two fundamental inquiry reports were tabled highlighting many injustices experienced by Indigenous people and the urgent need to take concrete action;

> THAT it affirm that a number of calls for justice made in the reports of the National Inquiry into Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls have yet to be followed through on;

> THAT it also affirm that most of the calls for action made in the Public Inquiry Commission on relations between Indigenous Peoples and certain public services in Québec have yet to be completed;

> THAT it affirm that work to follow through on those calls for justice and for action in collaboration with Indigenous partners needs to be intensified;

> THAT it recall that the tragic death this week of Joyce Echaquan is a stark example that there is still a long way to go toward providing Indigenous Peoples the dignity they rightly deserve;

> THAT, lastly, the Members of the National Assembly observe a minute of silence in memory of all the missing and murdered Indigenous women and girls and their families.

The question was put on this motion; in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 15 September 2020, a vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.

At the request of Ms. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Massé, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, together with Mr. Legault, Premier, Ms. Anglade, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Bérubé, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recall that, one year ago, it received the report from the Public Inquiry Commission on relations between Indigenous Peoples and certain public services in Québec containing 142 calls to action;

THAT it recall that, on 8 October 2019, the Government pledged to recognize the principles of the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples and negotiate its implementation with the First Nations;

THAT it underscore that, according to a Léger poll published on 12 August of this year, 91% of the people polled think that the Québec State has a key role to play in attaining and maintaining equality between First Nations, Inuit and Quebecers;

THAT it underscore that the AFNQL action plan on racism and discrimination, unveiled on 29 September 2020, reminds us of the importance of working in alliance with Indigenous peoples and invites all of Québec society and its institutions to take concrete action toward achieving a more harmonious coexistence; THAT it recall that such alliances are needed to forge bonds of trust and break down mistrust;

THAT it acknowledge that the report from the Public Inquiry Commission on relations between Indigenous Peoples and certain public services, in its call to action 3, urges the Government to work in collaboration with Indigenous authorities to draft and enact legislation guaranteeing that the provisions of the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples will be taken into account in the body of legislation under its jurisdiction;

THAT, accordingly, the National Assembly ask the Premier of Québec to reach a consensus with the Indigenous authorities as soon as possible on the definitions of the provisions and the principles of the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples in order to draft and enact the necessary legislative amendments.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the motion; in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 15 September 2020, a vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.

- the third, on a question from Ms. Robitaille (Bourassa-Sauvé) to Mr. Boulet, Minister of Labour, Employment and Social Solidarity, on the absence of cost-of-living assistance for the most vulnerable people of our society during the COVID-19 pandemic.
