Ms. Anglade, Leader of the Official Opposition, moved a motion on the 1970 October Crisis; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Massé, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, together with Mr. Legault, Premier, Ms. Anglade, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Bérubé, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly extend its sincerest condolences to the family, friends and relatives of Joyce Echaquan, as well as to the community of Manawan, the Atikamekw Nation and all Indigenous people;

THAT it recognize that this death was preceded by unacceptable and degrading racist comments;

THAT it recognize that Joyce Echaquan is not the first to have experienced racism in the health care system, and that her death, like others, is one too many and that it is more than urgent to take action to change this situation once and for all;

THAT it acknowledge that firing the individuals who committed these wrongs was necessary, but is insufficient in light of the sad circumstances surrounding the death of Joyce Echaquan;

THAT it recognize the role of the Québec state to take action as a leader to build bridges between nations;

THAT all Members of the National Assembly apologize to the family of Joyce Echaquan, the Atikamekw Nation and Indigenous people for the irreparable consequences of the racism experienced in Québec health institutions;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly observe a minute of silence in her memory.

The question was put on this motion; in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 15 September 2020, a vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that the COVID-19 pandemic and all the upheavals it has caused have increased anxiety levels across all levels of society and have had detrimental effects on a large number of Quebecers;

THAT it recognize that over the past months, the mental health, in particular of young people, students, women, workers, entrepreneurs and the elderly, has been weakened;

THAT it recall that mental health issues can have numerous consequences on a personal and professional level, and on society at large, if not addressed quickly;

THAT it acknowledge the significant spike in wait times for access to mental health care over the last six months and the need to prioritize resolving this very important issue; THAT it confirm the urgent need to convene a parliamentary committee to hear experts on the impact of the pandemic on Quebecers' mental health;

THAT, lastly, it call on the CAQ government to take all necessary measures immediately to improve Quebecers' access to mental health care in all regions of Québec.
