At the request of the President, Mr. Legault, Premier, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

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Motions Without Notice

Mr. Bérubé, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, together with Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on the French language and the Collège Dawson and McGill University expansions; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Roberge, Minister of Education, together with Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent), Ms. Labrie (Sherbrooke), Ms. Hivon (Joliette), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 11th edition of the Semaine pour l'école publique (SPEP), whose theme is "Notre école publique, on l'aime!", organized by the Fédération autonome de l'enseignement;

THAT it reiterate the crucial importance of public schools' threefold mission, which is to educate, socialize and provide qualifications;

THAT it join the SPEP spokesperson, Philippe Laprise, in recognizing not only the tremendous work of public school staff, but also the perseverance of all students, youth and adults;

THAT the National Assembly recognize the essential role public schools must fulfill as drivers of equal opportunity and social justice in Québec by providing free, accessible and universal education;

THAT the National Assembly recognize the exceptional contribution of public schools in developing Québec society.

THAT it take note of the number of confirmed cases among those 65 and over, which has risen from just under 40 a day to around 100 a day over the past two weeks;

THAT it recall that tens of thousands of seniors live in private seniors' residences (PSR) in Québec;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government to take all necessary measures to protect seniors living in PSRs, in particular by limiting the movement of staff between these residences as much as possible while ensuring services are not interrupted.
