By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Rouleau, Minister for Transport, together with Mr. Arcand (Mont-Royal-Outremont), Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

Passage

Ms. Blais, Minister Responsible for Seniors and Informal Caregivers, moved the passage of Bill 56, An Act to recognize and support caregivers and to amend various legislative provisions.

After debate thereon, the question was put on this motion; in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 20 October 2020, a vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin) moved:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Québec government to quickly implement an interdepartmental plan, coordinated by the Ministère du Conseil exécutif, to fight against the social polarization and radicalization that may lead to violence.

Ms. Soucy, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for her reply; 49 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 29 minutes 11 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 10 minutes 26 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 9 minutes 23 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 12 minutes to the Member for Marie-Victorin. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

At the beginning of her address, Ms. Girault, Minister of International Relations and La Francophonie, moved:

THAT the motion moved by the Member for Marie-Victorin be amended as follows:

By replacing the words "an interdepartmental plan," by "actions";

By striking out the words "coordinated by the Ministère du Conseil exécutif,".

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Québec government to quickly implement actions to fight against the social polarization and radicalization that may lead to violence.

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin) and on the amendment motion moved by Ms. Girault, Minister of International Relations and La Francophonie, subject to the permission of its author.

During her address, Ms. Perry Mélançon (Gaspé) moved:

THAT the motion moved by the Member for Marie-Victorin be amended by adding the following paragraph at the end: "THAT, pursuant to Standing Order 119, the National Assembly order the Committee on Institutions to hold public consultations on the polarization and radicalization that may lead to violence and to transmit its recommendations to the Assembly."

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Québec government to quickly implement an interdepartmental plan, coordinated by the Ministère du Conseil exécutif, to fight against the social polarization and radicalization that may lead to violence;

THAT, pursuant to Standing Order 119, the National Assembly order the Committee on Institutions to hold public consultations on the polarization and radicalization that may lead to violence and to transmit its recommendations to the Assembly.

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin) and on the amendment motions moved by Ms. Girault, Minister of International Relations and La Francophonie, and Ms. Perry Mélançon (Gaspé), subject to the permission of its author.

During her address, Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent) moved:

THAT the motion moved by the Member for Marie-Victorin be amended as follows:

By adding the following second paragraph: "THAT it ask the CAQ government to improve the funding granted to initiatives aimed at fighting disinformation like the "30 seconds to check it out" training developed by the Fédération professionnelle des journalistes du Québec." The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Québec government to quickly implement an interdepartmental plan, coordinated by the Ministère du Conseil exécutif, to fight against the social polarization and radicalization that may lead to violence;

THAT it ask the CAQ government to enhance the funding granted to initiatives aimed at fighting disinformation like the "30 seconds to check it out" training developed by the Fédération professionnelle des journalistes du Québec.
