Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent), together with Ms. Labrie (Sherbrooke), Ms. Hivon (Joliette), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on ventilation and air quality in Québec schools; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), together with Mr. Arcand (Mont-Royal-Outremont), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on the structuring public transit network for Québec City; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Bérubé, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, together with Ms. Melançon (Verdun), Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge the tabling, on 3 November 2020, of Bill C-10 by the Government of Canada, which essentially aims to ensure that Web giants are subject to the *Broadcasting Act*;

THAT it note that the bill provides that broadcasting companies must call on Canadian resources for the creation and presentation of their content, without however specifying the consideration that must be given to French-language content;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Gouvernement du Québec to call on the Government of Canada to determine fair and equitable quotas for original Québec and French-language content and that it include them in the *Broadcasting Act*.

THAT it call on the Québec government to consider modifications to the *Expropriation Act* so that municipalities can acquire natural environments for conservation purposes at a reasonable cost to taxpayers, in accordance with the request put forth by the Montreal Metropolitan Community on 22 November 2019.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

The President informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 11 November 2020, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mr. Nadeau-Dubois, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge the scientific advances on the topic of COVID-19 aerosol transmission and note that this risk factor is now officially recognized by Health Canada;

THAT it be concerned about statistics showing that a significant portion of COVID-19 outbreaks have occurred in school environments:

THAT it recognize that a majority of schools in Québec are in poor to very poor condition, which, among other things, results in inadequate ventilation;

THAT it take note that proper ventilation of indoor spaces is one of the best means, along with mask wearing, of combatting aerosol transmission:

THAT it ask the Government to take all necessary measures to make Québec schools safer;

THAT, to that end, the National Assembly call on the Québec government to provide CO_2 detectors and portable air purifiers to all classes as soon as possible and wherever necessary.
