

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 10 November 2020, on the motion moved by Mr. Charette, Minister of the Environment and the Fight Against Climate Change, that Bill 65, An Act to amend mainly the Environment Quality Act with respect to deposits and selective collection, do now pass in principle.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the motion; at 12:24 p.m., in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 20 October 2020, Ms. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for no longer than 10 minutes so that a recorded division could be held.

The proceedings resumed at 12:28 p.m.

A vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Government Motions

The Assembly held the debate on the motion that arose from the tabling of the Agreement on social security between Québec and the Republic of Serbia, on 20 October 2020, by Ms. Girault, Minister of International Relations and La Francophonie.

The motion reads as follows:

THAT, pursuant to section 22.3 of the *Act respecting the Ministère des Relations internationales*, the National Assembly approve the Agreement on social security between Québec and the Republic of Serbia.

Ms. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 58 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 34 minutes 51 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 12 minutes 27 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 11 minutes 12 seconds to the Third Opposition Group, and 1 minute 30 seconds to each independent Member. However, if only one independent Member takes part in the debate, that Member's speaking time is 2 minutes. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

At 1:00 p.m., Ms. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until $3:00\ p.m.$

Accordingly, pursuant to Standing Order 97, the debate on the motion moved by Ms. Girault, Minister of International Relations and La Francophonie, was adjourned in the name of Ms. St-Pierre (Acadie).

The proceedings resumed at 3.01 p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Nadeau-Dubois, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, moved:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge the scientific advances on the topic of COVID-19 aerosol transmission and note that this risk factor is now officially recognized by Health Canada;

THAT it be concerned about statistics showing that a significant portion of COVID-19 outbreaks have occurred in school environments;

THAT it recognize that a majority of schools in Québec are in poor to very poor condition, which, among other things, results in inadequate ventilation;

THAT it take note that proper ventilation of indoor spaces is one of the best means, along with mask wearing, to combat aerosol transmission;

THAT it ask the Government to take all necessary measures to make Québec schools safer;

THAT, to that end, the National Assembly call on the Québec government to provide CO2 detectors and portable air purifiers to all classes as soon as possible and wherever necessary.

Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for his reply; 48 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 28 minutes 5 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 21 minutes 23 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 9 minutes 2 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to each independent Member. However, if only one independent Member takes part in the debate, that Member's speaking time is 2 minutes. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

At the end of his address, Mr. Roberge, Minister of Education, moved:

THAT the motion moved by Mr. Nadeau-Dubois, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, be amended as follows:

By adding the words ", particularly in specific circumstances" at the end of the first paragraph;

By replacing the words "be concerned about" and "significant" by "acknowledge" and "non negligible", respectively, in the second paragraph;

By replacing the words "a majority of" by "a significant number of", by replacing the words ", which, among other things, results in inadequate ventilation" after "very poor condition" by "due to the under-funding of past governments, which could result, in some cases, in insufficient ventilation" in the third paragraph;

By replacing "is one of the best means" by "is one of the means" and by adding "and complying with health measures" after "mask wearing" in the fourth paragraph;

By adding "to ask the Direction de la Santé publique to assess, in light of the update of the upcoming recommendations from the INSPQ on ventilation of indoor spaces, the relevance of acquiring portable air purifiers for all classes" after "call on the Québec government" and by "striking out the words "to provide CO2 detectors and portable air purifiers to all classes as soon as possible and" in the sixth paragraph.

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge the scientific advances on the topic of COVID-19 aerosol transmission and note that this risk factor is now officially recognized by Health Canada, particularly in specific circumstances;

THAT it acknowledge statistics showing that a non negligible portion of COVID-19 outbreaks have occurred in school environments:

THAT it recognize that a significant number of schools in Québec are in poor to very poor condition due to the underfunding of past governments, which could result, in some cases, in insufficient ventilation;

THAT it take note that proper ventilation of indoor spaces is one of the means, along with mask wearing and complying with health measures, to combat aerosol transmission;

THAT it ask the Government to take all necessary measures to make Québec schools safer;

THAT, to that end, the National Assembly call on the Québec government to ask the Direction de la Santé publique to assess, in light of the update of the upcoming recommendations from the INSPQ on ventilation of indoor spaces, the relevance of acquiring portable air purifiers for all classes wherever necessary.

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Mr. Nadeau-Dubois, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, and on the amendment motion moved by Mr. Roberge, Minister of Education, subject to the permission of its author.

During her address, Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent), moved:

THAT the motion moved by Mr. Nadeau-Dubois, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, be amended as follows:

By adding the following fifth paragraph: "THAT it ask the Government to produce a situation report on ventilation in Québec schools and to table it in the National Assembly by 8 December 2020;".

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge the scientific advances on the topic of COVID-19 aerosol transmission and note that this risk factor is now officially recognized by Health Canada;

THAT it be concerned about statistics showing that a significant portion of COVID-19 outbreaks have occurred in school environments:

THAT it recognize that a majority of schools in Québec are in poor to very poor condition, which, among other things, results in inadequate ventilation;

THAT it take note that proper ventilation of indoor spaces is one of the best means, along with mask wearing, to combat aerosol transmission:

THAT it ask the Government to produce a situation report on ventilation in Québec schools and to table it in the National Assembly by 8 December 2020;

THAT it ask the Government to take all necessary measures to make Québec schools safer;

THAT, to that end, the National Assembly call on the Québec government to provide CO2 detectors and portable air purifiers to all classes as soon as possible and wherever necessary.

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Mr. Nadeau-Dubois, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, and on the amendment motions moved by Mr. Roberge, Minister of Education, and Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent), subject to the permission of its author.

The debate being concluded, the question was first put on the amendment motion moved by Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent); in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 20 October 2020, a vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.
