By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 84.1 and 185, Ms. Lecours (Les Plaines), together with Ms. St-Pierre (Acadie), Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve), Ms. Perry Mélançon (Gaspé), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly take note of the tabling of the report of the Select Committee on the Sexual Exploitation of Minors and that it urge the Québec government to formally and solemnly declare that this is a national priority;

THAT it emphasize the work of those who are fully engaged in the fight against this scourge and sincerely thank those who contributed so generously to the Committee's work;

THAT it express its steadfast solidarity with and support for minors who have been the victims of sexual exploitation and those close to them; THAT it strongly encourage all Quebecers to become aware of the gravity of the situation and the disastrous consequences for the victims, and motivate them to protect minors and eradicate this bane of society.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Labrie (Sherbrooke), together with Mr. Roberge, Minister of Education and Higher Education, Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent), Ms. Hivon (Joliette), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly note that the complaint review process in the school system does not meet the needs of students and families because it is perceived as being biased, ineffective and difficult to access; THAT it recognize that the lack of confidence in this process sometimes causes students and their families to use the media and social media platforms to be heard, and that it is necessary to restore confidence in the complaint review process;

THAT the National Assembly recall that in 2017 the Ombudsman tabled a damning report describing the Student Ombudsman's office as dysfunctional and making 19 recommendations to improve the complaints review process in the school system;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Québec government to follow up on the Québec Ombudsman's report and to reform the Student Ombudsman's office to ensure that it becomes a more effective mechanism, the gateway to the complaint review procedure and fully independent of school service centres, and that it has jurisdiction over private schools;

THAT the National Assembly call on the Government to commit to tabling a bill reforming the office of the Student Ombudsman by June 2021.

THAT, lastly, this review consider, in particular, creating a compensation program with its own operating budget.
