Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

The President issued his directive on the question raised by the House Leader of the Third Opposition Group on 8 December 2020 concerning the disclosure of the draft recommendations made to the Committee on Health and Social Services within the framework of its order of initiative on the alarming increase in the use by children and youth of psychostimulants in relation to attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD).

RULING FROM THE CHAIR

Certain information must be disclosed to parliamentarians before being disclosed to others, out of deference for the important duties of the office they hold. This includes not only bills but also reports that must be tabled in the Assembly. Some authors of parliamentary law are of the opinion that revealing the contents of a committee report before it is tabled in the House may constitute contempt of Parliament. The importance given to the confidential nature of the work conducted in the preparation of committee reports is clear in numerous decisions rendered on the subject in several jurisdictions. This case, however, is not about the disclosure of the final report of a committee or even that of a draft report. Rather, it is about a working document produced for the committee's steering committee, which compiles, by theme, the recommendations proposed by each parliamentary group.

Not all documents have a special status wherein their disclosure could constitute contempt of Parliament. For example, before a bill is introduced in the Assembly, its directions and preliminary versions of it may be the subject of consultation and discussion. Only the communication of the text of a bill before its introduction may constitute contempt of Parliament.

In keeping with this principle, the disclosure of a working document that does not include the committee's final conclusions relating to its order of initiative, but rather a number of draft recommendations for consideration, cannot be likened to the disclosure of a draft report or to the early disclosure of the final report on the order of initiative.

Likewise, we cannot, in this case, characterize the communication as being an attempt to interfere with the committee's work. It appears that the communication was rather geared toward assessing the feasibility of the recommendations, which does not constitute an attempt to influence the committee's work or to impose the government department's views as to which recommendations to accept.

However, discussions that a committee has about the observations, conclusions and recommendations it may adopt at the end of an order of initiative take place in deliberative sessions that are not public. The release of confidential information can break the trust built up between committee members and undermine the committee's mandates. It is therefore essential to maintain a context conducive to ensuring that committees have this privileged space for discussion. This principle does not apply exclusively to parliamentarians, but also to all members of their staff, who must exercise great care when called on to assist them in parliamentary proceedings of a confidential or private nature.

One of the purposes of orders of initiative is to enhance the role of Parliament and its Members by empowering them to perform their duties more effectively and with greater autonomy vis-à-vis the Executive. For this reason, the disclosure, to employees of the Executive, of the recommendations a committee may potentially adopt with regard to an order of initiative could give the impression of the Executive having influence over a committee's final decisions with regard to its work, a situation that would compromise the principle underlying orders of initiative.

Debates on Reports from Committees

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 9 December 2020, on consideration of the report from the Committee on Culture and Education, which held public hearings on 26, 27, 28, 29 and 30 August 2019 within the framework of special consultations on the order of initiative on the future of the news media. The report contains observations and 20 recommendations.

The debate expired and, pursuant to Standing Order 95, no question was put.

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Select Committee on the Sexual Exploitation of Minors, which held public hearings on 4, 5, 6 and 7 November 2019, and on 20, 21 and 23 January as well as 24 August 2020 within the framework of special consultations on the sexual exploitation of minors. The report contains 58 recommendations.

Ms. Soucy, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 58 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 34 minutes 51 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 12 minutes 27 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 11 minutes 12 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to each independent Member. However, if only one independent Member takes part in the debate, that Member's speaking time is 2 minutes. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate expired and, pursuant to Standing Order 95, no question was put.

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Health and Social Services, which held public hearings on 6, 7, 8 and 13 November 2019 within the framework of special consultations on the order of initiative on the alarming increase in the use by children and youth of psychostimulants in relation to attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD). The report contains conclusions and 17 recommendations.

Ms. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to the limited debate on this motion: 58 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 34 minutes 51 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 12 minutes 27 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 11 minutes 12 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to each independent Member. However, if only one independent Member takes part in the debate, that Member's speaking time is 2 minutes. Within this framework, any time not used by an independent Member or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate was adjourned in the name of Ms. Lecours (Lotbinière-Frontenac).
