By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Charette, Minister of the Environment and the Fight Against Climate Change, together with Ms. Melançon (Verdun), Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Mr. Tardif (Rivière-du-Loup-Témiscouata), moved:

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière), together with Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent), Ms. Labrie (Sherbrooke), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin) and Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), moved:

THAT the National Assembly highlight the outstanding work carried out by teachers for young people's academic success;

THAT it note that negotiations are still under way with teachers and that a number of strike mandates have been voted on;

THAT it affirm that the Government has an obligation to hear teachers' cries for help and that it must continue to work to minimize the impacts on Québec students;

THAT the Assembly recall the urgent need to promote the teaching profession and make it more attractive by providing better working conditions and a higher entry-level salary;

THAT it note Premier François Legault's commitment, which he reiterated on 28 January 2021, to keep all his election promises despite the pandemic;

THAT it ask the Government to meet its commitment to abolish the first six steps in the teachers' salary scale in order to provide a higher salary for new teachers before the next general election.

The question was put on this motion; in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 2 February 2021, a vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.

#### **Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition**

Mr. Bérubé, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, moved:

THAT the National Assembly unequivocally affirm that it is the sole guardian of the democratic will of the people of Québec;

THAT the National Assembly reiterate that the office of Lieutenant-Governor is essentially symbolic and inherited from the colonial past of Québec and Canada;

THAT the Assembly recall the CAQ government's commitment to abolish the office of Lieutenant-Governor "when the context permits it";

THAT it emphasize the fact that 74% of Quebecers wish to abolish the monarchy in Québec;

THAT it take note of the recent resignation of the last Governor General of Canada, following a report confirming a toxic work environment, as well as Barbados' decision to free itself of the British monarchy by November 30 of this year;

THAT it demand that the Government of Canada reimburse the Government of Québec the portion of expenses related to the office of Governor General paid by Québec taxpayers;

THAT the National Assembly agree to abolish the office of Lieutenant-Governor and all other symbols of the British monarchy in Québec.

Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for his reply; 47 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 27 minutes 58 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 9 minutes 59 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 19 minutes 3 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to each independent Member. However, if only one independent Member takes part in the debate, that Member's speaking time is 2 minutes. Within this framework, any time not used by independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

The debate arose thereon.

At the end of her address, Ms. LeBel, Minister Responsible for Democratic Institutions and Electoral Reform, moved:

THAT the motion moved by the Leader of the Third Opposition Group be amended

- 1. by replacing "sole" in the first paragraph by "foremost";
- 2. by replacing "the colonial past of Québec and Canada" in the second paragraph by "a constitutional history whose relevance we may certainly question";
- 3. by inserting ", according to a poll," after "the fact that" in the fourth paragraph;
  - 4. by striking out the sixth paragraph;
- 5. by inserting "that it is relevant" after "agree" in the last paragraph and by replacing "and all other symbols of the British monarchy in Québec" in that paragraph by "when the context permits it".

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly unequivocally affirm that it is the foremost guardian of the democratic will of the people of Ouébec;

THAT the National Assembly reiterate that the office of Lieutenant-Governor is essentially symbolic and inherited from a constitutional history whose relevance we may certainly question;

THAT the Assembly recall the CAQ government's commitment to abolish the office of Lieutenant-Governor "when the context permits it";

THAT it emphasize the fact that, according to a poll, 74% of Quebecers wish to abolish the monarchy in Québec;

THAT it take note of the recent resignation of the last Governor General of Canada, following a report confirming a toxic work environment, as well as Barbados' decision to free itself of the British monarchy by November 30 of this year;

THAT the National Assembly agree that it is relevant to abolish the office of Lieutenant-Governor "when the context permits it".

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Mr. Bérubé, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, and on the amendment motion proposed by Ms. LeBel, Minister Responsible for Democratic Institutions and Electoral Reform, subject to the permission of its author.

At the end of his address, Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage) moved:

THAT the motion moved by the Leader of the Third Opposition Group be amended as follows:

1. by adding ", including the Members' obligation to take the oath of allegiance" at the end of the seventh paragraph.

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly unequivocally affirm that it is the sole guardian of the democratic will of the people of Québec;

THAT the National Assembly reiterate that the office of Lieutenant-Governor is essentially symbolic and inherited from the colonial past of Québec and Canada;

THAT the Assembly recall the CAQ government's commitment to abolish the office of Lieutenant-Governor "when the context permits it";

THAT it emphasize the fact that 74% of Quebecers wish to abolish the monarchy in Québec;

THAT it take note of the recent resignation of the last Governor General of Canada, following a report confirming a toxic work environment, as well as Barbados' decision to free itself of the British monarchy by November 30 of this year;

THAT it demand that the Government of Canada reimburse the Government of Québec the portion of expenses related to the office of Governor General paid by Québec taxpayers;

THAT the National Assembly agree to abolish the office of Lieutenant-Governor and all other symbols of the British monarchy in Québec, including the Members' obligation to take the oath of allegiance.

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Mr. Bérubé, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, and on the amendment motions proposed by Ms. LeBel, Minister Responsible for Democratic Institutions and Electoral Reform, and by Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage), subject to the permission of its author.

Pursuant to Standing Order 98.1, Mr. Bérubé, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, accepted the amendment proposed by Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage) and refused the amendment proposed by Ms. LeBel, Minister Responsible for Democratic Institutions and Electoral Reform.

The debate being concluded, the question was first put on the amendment motion proposed by Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage); at 4:30 p.m., in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 2 February 2021, Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for no longer than 10 minutes so that a recorded division could be held.
