Ms. Lessard-Therrien (Rouyn-Noranda–Témiscamingue), together with Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin) and Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), moved a motion on health care professionals in the Abitibi-Témiscamingue region; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), together with Mr. Lamontagne, Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, Mr. Rousselle (Vimont), Ms. Lessard-Therrien (Rouyn-Noranda–Témiscamingue), Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Mr. Tardif (Rivière-du-Loup–Témiscouata), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recall that the agriculture sector plays a key role in Québec's economy and regional development;

THAT it reaffirm its support for the protection of the supply management system for egg, milk and poultry producers;

THAT it ask the Government of Canada to fully protect the supply management model under future international agreements.

The question was put on this motion; in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 9 March 2021, a vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.

> THAT the National Assembly recall that its Members unanimously stated on 3 December 2020 that the fight against the sexual exploitation of minors is a national priority;

THAT the National Assembly recognize the importance of the work in progress to endow the Québec government with an inter-ministerial plan that includes effective and concrete actions to respond to the recommendations of the Select Committee on the Sexual Exploitation of Minors;

THAT it recognize the importance of conveying a strong and unequivocal message that the sexual exploitation of minors is not tolerated in our society, that we cannot stand idly by in the face of these heinous crimes, and that it acknowledge that all government stakeholders, citizens and businesses must take action to help these young victims;

THAT it undertake to create the optimal conditions to raise awareness and fight for this issue in order to bring about a lasting change in attitudes and, ultimately, to prevent the sexual exploitation of minors;

THAT the National Assembly commit to observe an annual remembrance to help it stay the course towards an ideal to be achieved by declaring March 4 National Fight Against the Sexual Exploitation of Minors Day and that the first week of March constitute the National Fight Against the Sexual Exploitation of Minors Week.

The question was put on this motion; in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 9 March 2021, a vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 84.1 and pursuant to Standing Order 146, Mr. Caire, Deputy Government House Leader, moved:

THAT the National Assembly give effect to the order of reference given to the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain within the framework of the consideration of Bill 85, An Act to facilitate the conduct of the 7 November 2021 municipal general election in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic, to hold special consultations and public hearings on Wednesday, 10 March 2021 after Routine Proceedings from approximately 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. and from 2:30 p.m. to 6:15 p.m., and on Thursday, 11 March 2021 after Routine Proceedings from approximately 11:30 a.m. to 12:45 p.m. and from 2:00 p.m. to 3:45 p.m.

THAT, for this purpose, the Committee hear the following organizations:

Ville de Montréal Ville de Québec Union des municipalités du Québec Fédération québécoise des municipalités Association des directeurs généraux des municipalités du Québec Élections Québec Groupe Femmes, Politique et Démocratie Research Chair on Democracy and Parliamentary Institutions: THAT a period of 12 minutes be set aside for opening statements, allocated as follows: 6 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government, 4 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition, 1 minute to the Second Opposition Group and 1 minute to the Third Opposition Group;

THAT the presentation by each organization, except by Élections Québec, last no longer than 10 minutes and the exchange with the Committee members last no longer than 35 minutes, allocated as follows: 17 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government, 11 minutes 40 seconds to the Official Opposition, 2 minutes 55 seconds to the Second Opposition Group and 2 minutes 55 seconds to the Third Opposition Group;

THAT the presentation by Élections Québec last no longer than 10 minutes and the exchange with the Committee members last no longer than 65 minutes, allocated as follows: 32 minutes 30 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government, 21 minutes 40 seconds to the Official Opposition, 5 minutes 25 seconds to the Second Opposition Group and 5 minutes 25 seconds to the Third Opposition Group;

THAT those being heard be permitted to testify by video conference;

THAT a 15-minute interval be scheduled between discussions with each organization;

THAT the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.

Passage

Mr. Lamontagne, Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, moved the passage of Bill 77, An Act respecting the Institut de technologie agroalimentaire du Québec.

After debate thereon, the question was put on this motion; at 12:23 p.m., in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 9 March 2021, Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for no longer than 10 minutes so that a recorded division could be held.

The proceedings resumed at 12:26 p.m.

A vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

After debate thereon, the question was put on this motion; at 12:57 p.m., in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 9 March 2021, Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for no longer than 10 minutes so that a recorded division could be held.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Ms. Labrie (Sherbrooke) tabled the following:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that the current health and economic crisis has had a greater impact on women than men and that as a result this crisis, has increased gender inequalities in Québec; THAT it ask the CAQ government to conduct a genderbased analysis (GBA+) of its economic recovery measures to assess their impact on gender equality and that it make the assessment public;

THAT, to achieve the objective of reducing inequalities, the CAQ government's economic recovery measures include additional investments in infrastructure to create affordable housing, new spaces in childcare centres (CPE) and additional places in shelters for women who are victims of violence in order to meet the increasing needs in all these sectors;

THAT the economic recovery measures include a significant improvement of working conditions and salaries in the public sector in order to enhance jobs in sectors that are traditionally held by women and to facilitate work-family balance;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly affirm that Québec's economic and social recovery must include achieving gender equality.

Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for her reply; 47 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 27 minutes 46 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 21 minutes 18 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 7 minutes 56 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to each independent Member. However, if only one independent Member takes part in the debate, that Member's speaking time is 2 minutes. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 53 and 59, Ms. Labrie (Sherbrooke) tabled the following:

Reports and studies related to gender inequalities, the status of women and genderbased analysis.

During her address, Ms. Charest, Minister Responsible for the Status of Women, moved:

THAT the motion moved by Ms. Labrie (Sherbrooke) be amended as follows:

(1) By striking out the third paragraph;

(2) By replacing "include", "working conditions and salaries in the public sector in order to enhance" and "to facilitate" in the fourth paragraph by "seek to achieve", "Quebecers' conditions, for example, by enhancing" and "by facilitating", respectively.

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that the current health and economic crisis has had a greater impact on women than men and that as a result this crisis has increased gender inequalities in Québec;

THAT it ask the CAQ government to conduct a genderbased analysis (GBA+) of its economic recovery measures to assess their impact on gender equality and that it make the assessment public;

THAT the economic recovery measures seek to achieve a significant improvement of Quebecers' conditions, for example, by enhancing jobs in sectors that are traditionally held by women and by facilitating work-family balance;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly affirm that Québec's economic and social recovery must include achieving gender equality.

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Ms. Labrie (Sherbrooke) and on the amendment motion moved by Ms. Charest, Minister Responsible for the Status of Women, subject to the permission of its author.

Pursuant to Standing Order 98.1, Ms. Labrie (Sherbrooke) refused the amendment proposed by Ms. Charest, Minister Responsible for the Status of Women.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion; at 4:30 p.m., in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 9 March 2021, Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for no longer than 10 minutes so that a recorded division could be held.

The proceedings resumed at 4:31 p.m.

A vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.
