By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Bérubé, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, together with Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister Responsible for Laicity and Parliamentary Reform, Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage), Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Mr. Thouin (Rousseau), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recall that the Québec nation has never consented to the constitutional order imposed by the Canadian government in 1982;

THAT it affirm that the Québec nation can legitimately establish its rules for coexistence, in line with its history, culture and institutions;

THAT it reiterate that all Quebecers are equal before the law and that it applies to all;

THAT it recall that the legislation passed by the National Assembly applies throughout the whole of Québec.

The question was put on this motion; in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 13 April 2021, a vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Dufour, Minister of Forests, Wildlife and Parks, moved that Bill 88, An Act to amend the Act respecting the conservation and development of wildlife and other legislative provisions, do now pass in principle.

A debate arose thereon.

At 1:00 p.m., Ms. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 2:30 p.m.

Accordingly, pursuant to Standing Order 97, the debate on the motion moved by Mr. Dufour, Minister of Forests, Wildlife and Parks, was adjourned in the name of Mr. Kelley (Jacques-Cartier).

The proceedings resumed at 2:30 p.m.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Ms. Lessard-Therrien (Rouyn-Noranda-Témiscamingue) moved:

THAT, on the occasion of Earth Day, the National Assembly recall the need to protect Québec's natural environments so that Quebecers can access them to enjoy activities in a manner that is respectful of natural ecosystems;

THAT it note that the CAQ government has not reached its own goal of protecting 17% of the territory throughout Québec;

THAT it recall that 83 protected area projects have been refused by the Government and that the vast majority of these are located in the sectors most coveted by the forest industry; THAT the National Assembly demand that the Government issue an order declaring a moratorium on logging in these 83 protected area projects until the target is reached in each region of Québec.

Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for her reply; 47 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 27 minutes 46 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 21 minutes 18 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 7 minutes 56 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to each independent Member. However, if only one independent Member takes part in the debate, that Member's speaking time is 2 minutes. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

At the end of his address, Mr. Roy (Bonaventure) moved:

THAT the motion moved by the Member for Rouyn-Noranda–Témiscamingue be amended by replacing the last paragraph by the following paragraph:

"THAT the National Assembly demand that the Government set up a special parliamentary committee in order to shed light on the management of public forests by the Ministère des Forêts, de la Faune et des Parcs."

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT, on the occasion of Earth Day, the National Assembly recall the need to protect Québec's natural environments so that Quebecers can access them to enjoy activities in a manner that is respectful of natural ecosystems;

THAT it note that the CAQ government has not reached its own goal of protecting 17% of the territory throughout Québec;

THAT it recall that 83 protected area projects have been refused by the Government and that the vast majority of these are located in the sectors most coveted by the forest industry;

THAT the National Assembly demand that the Government set up a special parliamentary committee in order to shed light on the management of public forests by the Ministère des Forêts, de la Faune et des Parcs.

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Ms. Lessard-Therrien (Rouyn-Noranda–Témiscamingue) and on the amendment motion proposed by Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), subject to the permission of its author.

Pursuant to Standing Order 98.1, Ms. Lessard-Therrien (Rouyn-Noranda– Témiscamingue) accepted the amendment proposed by Mr. Roy (Bonaventure).

The debate being concluded, the question was first put on the amendment motion proposed by Mr. Roy (Bonaventure); in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 13 April 2021, a vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.

The amendment motion was negatived on the following vote:
