Motions Without Notice

Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion), together with Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion about the prices of housing in the real estate sector; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière), together with Ms. Laforest, Minister Responsible for the Saguenay–Lac-Saint-Jean Region, Ms. St-Pierre (Acadie), Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Mr. Thouin (Rousseau), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 50th anniversary of the Saint-Jean-Vianney landslide, in Saguenay, which occurred on 4 May 1971;

THAT it honour the memory of the 31 people who tragically lost their lives in this natural disaster;

THAT it show its solidarity with the loved ones of those who lost their lives and those who experienced this tragedy;

THAT it welcome the erection of a memorial on the site of the tragedy by Ville de Saguenay;

THAT it underscore that this event was officially designated a historic event under the *Cultural Heritage Act* on 4 May 2021;

THAT, lastly, the Members of the National Assembly observe a minute of silence in memory of the victims of this event.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

THAT it recognize the passion and expertise of its 7,500 employees who are committed to enabling Quebecers to discover products from around the world, with more than 35,000 products from 3,700 suppliers in 80 countries;

THAT, lastly, it recognize the SAQ's commitment to promoting Québec products and its support for the wine and spirits industry in Québec.
