Motions Without Notice

Ms. Melançon (Verdun), together with Ms. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), Ms. Perry Mélançon (Gaspé), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on implementing the recommendations included in the report entitled *Rebâtir la confiance* and the report of the Select Committee on the Sexual Exploitation of Minors; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), together with Ms. Montpetit (Maurice-Richard), Mr. Arseneau, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on mandatory overtime in the health care system; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Arseneau, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, together with Ms. Montpetit (Maurice-Richard), Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on expenditures in the health care system for independent labour; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister Responsible for the French Language, together with Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

Considering the unanimous adoption of resolution 21-09-01-11 by the Council of Commissioners of the English Montreal School Board on 1 September 2021;

THAT the National Assembly reiterate that Quebecers form a nation, and that this fact is indisputable and has been repeatedly recognized;

THAT it reaffirm that French is the only official language of Québec;

THAT it reiterate that the French language is in decline in Québec, especially in workplaces and businesses;

THAT it recall that the protection and promotion of the French language are historical responsibilities of the Québec government;

THAT, as the body representing the entire nation, the Assembly constitutes the legitimate democratic forum for developing the measures needed to ensure the future of French in Québec;

THAT it insist on the importance of holding calm and respectful debates;

THAT it deplore any form of Québec bashing or *Québecophobia*;

THAT the National Assembly categorically denounce the disparaging remarks about the Québec nation made by the English Montreal School Board in the resolution dated 1 September 2021.

The question was put on this motion; in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 14 September 2021, a vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Mr. Tanguay (LaFontaine) moved:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge the importance of educational childcare services for child development;

THAT it ask that access to a childcare space be a recognized right under the *Educational Childcare Act*, without conditions, in the same way the right to education is provided for in the *Education Act*.

Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for his reply; 51 minutes 15 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 31 minutes 53 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 11 minutes 23 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 7 minutes 58 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 7 minutes 30 seconds to the independent Members, subject to a maximum of 2 minutes each. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

At the end of his address, Mr. Lacombe, Minister of Families, moved:

THAT the motion moved by the Member for LaFontaine be amended as follows:

- 1- In the second paragraph, by replacing the word "be" by "continue to be", and replacing the words "without conditions, in the same way the right to education is provided for in the *Education Act*" by "taking into account the available resources and respecting the organization of childcare service providers";
- 2- By adding the following sentence after the second paragraph: "THAT it affirm its desire to complete the educational childcare service network."

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge the importance of educational childcare services for child development;

THAT it ask that access to a childcare space continue to be a recognized right under the *Educational Childcare Act*, taking into account the available resources and respecting the organization of childcare service providers;

THAT it affirm its desire to complete the educational childcare service network.

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Mr. Tanguay (LaFontaine) and on the amendment motion moved by Mr. Lacombe, Minister of Families, subject to the permission of its author.

At the end of her address, Ms. Hivon (Joliette) moved:

THAT the motion moved by the Member for LaFontaine be amended by adding the following paragraph at the end:

"THAT it demand that the Québec government grant massive salary adjustments to educators in the educational childcare service network in 2021." The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge the importance of educational childcare services for child development;

THAT it ask that access to a childcare space be a recognized right under the *Educational Childcare Act*, without conditions, in the same way the right to education is provided for in the *Education Act*;

THAT it demand that the Québec government grant massive salary adjustments to educators in the educational childcare service network in 2021.

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Mr. Tanguay (LaFontaine) and on the amendment motions moved by Mr. Lacombe, Minister of Families, and Ms. Hivon (Joliette), subject to the permission of its author.

Pursuant to Standing Order 98.1, Mr. Tanguay (LaFontaine) refused the amendments proposed by Mr. Lacombe, Minister of Families, and accepted the amendment proposed by Ms. Hivon (Joliette).

The debate being concluded, the question was first put on the amendment motion moved by Ms. Hivon (Joliette); at 5:00 p.m., in accordance with the motion carried on 14 September 2021, Ms. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for no longer than 10 minutes so that a recorded division could be held.
