#### **Oral Questions and Answers**

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

At the request of the President, Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister Responsible for the French Language, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

#### **Motions Without Notice**

Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière), together with Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on the Ray-Mont Logistiques transshipment platform project; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent. By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Julien, Minister of Energy and Natural Resources, together with Mr. Arcand (Mont-Royal–Outremont), Ms. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

> THAT the National Assembly recall that on 20 September of this year, the Governor of the State of New York announced that Hydro-Québec's Champlain Hudson Power Express (CHPE) project had been selected to deliver hydroelectricity to the heart of New York City and that this was the largest electricity export contract in Hydro-Québec's history;

> THAT it underline that this contribution of 1,250 megawatts (MW) of clean energy will power more than one million homes and gradually replace, by 2025, the fossil fuels that currently make up more than 85% of the region's power supply;

THAT it affirm that this agreement with New York is above all a recognition of Québec's expertise in the field of renewable energy and hydroelectricity;

THAT it recall that the Government has increasingly taken concrete actions to make this contract possible; in particular, it is under the Government's leadership, that on 16 October 2020, Québec electricity was recognized by the State of New York as clean energy;

THAT it recall that the Government has been working for nearly three years to make Québec the green battery of northeastern North America and that this news represents a major step towards achieving this vision, and an important contribution by Québec to reduce GHGs;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly rejoice in this historic partnership that will make it possible for Hydro-Québec to play a key role in North America's largest energy transition project. The question was put on this motion; in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 14 September 2021, a vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.

Ms. Melançon (Verdun), together with Ms. Lessard-Therrien (Rouyn-Noranda– Témiscamingue), Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on the withdrawal of Caisse de dépôt et placement du Québec from the fossil fuel industry; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), together with Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister Responsible for the French Language, Ms. David (Marguerite-Bourgeoys), Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recall the right to work in French in Québec;

THAT it recall that the use of the French language is a driver of emancipation for Quebecers, in addition to promoting equal opportunity and social justice;

THAT the National Assembly ask all Québec employers to do more to protect and promote French as the language of work;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government to prohibit the requirement of English in hiring, unless such knowledge is required to carry out the work; and even then, the employer must have first taken all reasonable means to avoid imposing such a requirement.

The question was put on this motion; in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 14 September 2021, a vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.

THAT the National Assembly reaffirm that no petroleum development and transportation project has achieved social acceptability in Québec;

THAT it express its concern that the increase in western Canadian oil and gas production will undermine global efforts to fight climate change;

THAT the National Assembly demand that the new Canadian government stop subsidizing oil and gas companies with Quebecers' money.
