Government Bills

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 21 September 2021, on the motion moved by Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister of Justice, that Bill 92, An Act to create a court specialized in sexual and domestic violence and respecting training of judges in these matters, do now pass in principle.

The debate being concluded, the question was first put on this motion; at 12:00 p.m., in accordance with the motion carried on 14 September 2021, Ms. Soucy, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for no longer than 10 minutes so that a recorded division could be held.

The proceedings resumed at 12:05 p.m.

A vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Accordingly, Bill 92 was passed in principle.

Mr. Schneeberger, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 92 be referred to the Committee on Institutions for clause-by-clause consideration.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Ms. Lessard-Therrien (Rouyn-Noranda-Témiscamingue) moved:

THAT the National Assembly reaffirm that no petroleum development and transportation project has achieved social acceptability in Québec;

THAT it express its concern that the increase in western Canadian oil and gas production will undermine global efforts to fight climate change;

THAT the National Assembly demand that the new Canadian government stop subsidizing oil and gas companies with Quebecers' money.

Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for her reply; 46 minutes 15 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 27 minutes 53 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 21 minutes 23 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 6 minutes 58 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 7 minutes 30 seconds to the independent Members, subject to a maximum of 2 minutes each. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

At the end of her address, Ms. LeBel, Minister Responsible for Canadian Relations and the Canadian Francophonie, moved:

THAT the motion moved by the Member for Rouyn-Noranda-Témiscamingue be amended as follows:

By inserting the following paragraph at the beginning of the wording:

"THAT the National Assembly acknowledge that no oil and gas development and exploration projects are currently being considered in Québec;";

By replacing the second paragraph by the following paragraph:

"THAT it note that no new oil and gas development and exploration projects have achieved social acceptability in Québec;";

By replacing "will undermine" in the third paragraph by "will hinder":

By replacing "demand that" and "stop subsidizing" by "ask" and "to reduce with a view to quickly eliminating all subsidies and financial assistance to", respectively, and by striking out "with Quebecers' money" in the last paragraph.

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge that no oil and gas development and exploration projects are currently being considered in Québec;

THAT it note that no new oil and gas development and exploration projects have achieved social acceptability in Québec;

THAT it express its concern that the increase in western Canadian oil and gas production will hinder global efforts to fight climate change;

THAT the National Assembly ask the new Canadian government to reduce with a view to quickly eliminating all subsidies and financial assistance to oil and gas companies.

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Ms. Lessard-Therrien (Rouyn-Noranda-Témiscamingue) and on the amendment motion moved by Ms. LeBel, Minister Responsible for Canadian Relations and the Canadian Francophonie, subject to the permission of its author.

At the end of his address, Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière) moved:

THAT the motion moved by the Member for Rouyn-Noranda-Témiscamingue be amended as follows:

By adding the following paragraph after the second paragraph:

"THAT it pass in principle Bill 391, An Act to amend the Environment Quality Act in order to assert the primacy of Québec's jurisdiction in this area;".

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly reaffirm that no petroleum development and transportation project has achieved social acceptability in Québec;

THAT it express its concern that the increase in western Canadian oil and gas production will undermine global efforts to fight climate change;

THAT it pass in principle Bill 391, An Act to amend the Environment Quality Act in order to assert the primacy of Québec's jurisdiction in this area;

THAT the National Assembly demand that the new Canadian government stop subsidizing oil and gas companies with Quebecers' money.

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Ms. Lessard-Therrien (Rouyn-Noranda–Témiscamingue) and on the amendment motions moved by Ms. LeBel, Minister Responsible for Canadian Relations and the Canadian Francophonie, and by Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière), subject to the permission of its author.
