#### **Motions Without Notice**

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Anglade, Leader of the Official Opposition, together with Mr. Legault, Premier, Mr. Nadeau-Dubois, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Arseneau, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure) and Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), moved:

> THAT, on the 25th anniversary of the death of former Québec Premier Robert Bourassa, the National Assembly highlight the historic and remarkable contribution he made to the development of Québec and his dedication to the Québec nation;

> THAT it recall that Robert Bourassa was responsible for the recognition of French as the official language of Québec as well as the creation of the *Québec Charter of Human Rights and Freedoms*;

THAT it highlight the many social advances made under Robert Bourassa's leadership, including introducing public health insurance, establishing local community service centres (CLSC), creating legal aid, passing the *Consumer Protection Act* and legislation regarding the status of artists, creating the Conseil du statut de la femme, lowering the age of majority from 21 to 18 and creating the Commission de la représentation électorale;

THAT it recall that Robert Bourassa's Liberal government paved the way for the development of the vast territory of James Bay and its hydroelectric potential, thus enabling Québec to acquire cutting-edge expertise in renewable energy production, something Québec is recognized for and which makes Quebecers proud;

THAT it also recall the unwavering leadership of Robert Bourassa on issues affecting First Nations, in particular by the signing of the *James Bay and Northern Québec Agreement* in 1975;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly proudly declare that Robert Bourassa's legacy is continuing to shape the daily lives of millions of Quebecers today in a positive way.

THAT the National Assembly recognize the exceptional contribution of public schools in developing Québec society.

### Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

The President informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 6 October 2021, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly recall the Québec government's demands made on 17 September 2019 and on 26 August 2021 by the Premier in the context of the last two federal election campaigns;

THAT it call for the modification of the legislative framework for environmental assessments in order to provide that only the Québec environmental impact assessment and review procedure apply to projects under Québec jurisdiction;

THAT it demand that the federal funds allocated to the fight against climate change and targeting sectors under Québec jurisdiction be subject to a block transfer to the Québec government;

THAT it pass in principle Bill 391, An Act to amend the Environment Quality Act, in order to assert the primacy of Québec's jurisdiction in this area.
