At the request of the President, Ms. Guilbault, Minister of Public Security, withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

Motions Without Notice

Ms. St-Pierre (Acadie), together with Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), Ms. Samson (Iberville), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on the sale of the heritage house Jean-Baptiste-Chevalier; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

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Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), together with Ms. Montpetit (Maurice-Richard), Mr. Arseneau, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on the penalties on premiums paid to nurses; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Ms. Richard (Duplessis), together with Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved a motion on the current long-term care delivery model; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. LeBel, Minister Responsible for Democratic Institutions and Electoral Reform, together with Ms. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Ms. Fournier (Marie-Victorin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly underline the importance of gender-balanced representation among the Members of the National Assembly;

THAT it recall the motion carried unanimously on 26 April 2017 affirming its commitment to making gender parity the goal to achieve in all sectors of society;

THAT it note that in the last general election, the four main parties achieved near parity, as at least 40% of their candidates were women;

THAT, lastly, it ask all the political parties to commit to the principle of parity by putting forward a minimum of 40% female candidates for the next general election.

The question was put on this motion; in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 14 September 2021, a vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its lack of vision and ambition as regards environmental protection and the fight against climate change, as well as for the lack of a serious and credible plan to deal with the climate emergency.

The debate continued on the Opening Speech of the Session, on the motion moved by Mr. Legault, Premier, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Ms. Anglade, Leader of the Official Opposition, Ms. David (Marguerite-Bourgeoys) and Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière), subject to the receivability of these motions.

At the end of her address, Ms. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the Coalition avenir Québec government for its inability to identify the causes that negatively affect the mental health and well-being of our young adults and to take action in this regard.

The debate continued on the Opening Speech of the Session, on the motion moved by Mr. Legault, Premier, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Ms. Anglade, Leader of the Official Opposition, Ms. David (Marguerite-Bourgeoys), Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière) and Ms. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), subject to the receivability of these motions.

At the end of her address, Ms. Melançon (Verdun) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for its lack of coherence as regards the fight against climate change and the lack of a concrete plan to achieve the Québec targets for reducing GHG emissions.

Mr. Girard, Minister of Finance, replaced the Minister for this debate.

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for the price shock that Québec households and businesses must endure in April 2022 due to the significant increase that will occur in electricity bills in the midst of economic recovery.
