At the end of her address, Ms. Samson (Iberville) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly censure the Premier of Québec for weaponizing the pandemic to justify his failure to fulfill several election promises, while declaring a state of health emergency, granting himself extraordinary powers and governing by decree and without accountability.
