Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 49, An Act to amend the Act respecting elections and referendums in municipalities, the Municipal Ethics and Good Conduct Act and various legislative provisions, together with the amendment transmitted by Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion).

The amendment was declared in order.

Ms. Soucy, Second Vice-President, interrupted the debate to inform the Assembly that she had received a request for a debate upon adjournment to be held on Thursday, 4 November 2021 on a question by Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve) to Mr. Charette, Minister of the Environment and the Fight Against Climate Change, about the Ray-Mont Logistics project.

The debate continued.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the amendment by Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion); at 12:28 p.m., in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 14 September 2021, Ms. Soucy, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for no longer than 10 minutes so that a recorded division could be held.

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 2 November 2021, on the motion moved by Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister Responsible for the French Language, that Bill 96, An Act respecting French, the official and common language of Québec, do now pass in principle.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent) moved:

THAT the National Assembly recall that the Premier has repeatedly stated that education was his number one priority;

THAT it take note that the school dropout rate has doubled in many regions of Québec;

THAT it note that there are more than 30,000 teachers not legally qualified in the education network;

THAT it take note that many school administration staff members have left the network due to burnout;

THAT it take note that hundreds of aspiring teachers do not have access to a qualifying master's degree despite the fact that their file meets admission requirements;

THAT it note that parents of students with special needs must send their bill to the Minister in order to be reimbursed for services that their children should have received at school;

THAT it take note that a serious shortage of personnel exists in school daycares;

THAT it note that the Minister of Education has not been able to implement a satisfactory response to these issues;

THAT, lastly, it demand that the Premier appoint, as soon as possible, a new Minister of Education capable of displaying the leadership required to bring together all the actors from the education network in order to remedy the situation.

Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for her reply; 51 minutes 15 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 31 minutes 27 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 11 minutes 39 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 8 minutes 9 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 7 minutes 30 seconds to the independent Members, subject to a maximum of 2 minutes each. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.
