Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. St-Pierre (Acadie), together with Ms. Dorion (Taschereau), Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure) and Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), moved:

THAT the National Assembly highlight the 150th anniversary of the Press Gallery, the association of parliamentary journalists in Québec City;

THAT it recall that being a member of the Press Gallery is a privilege and carries a responsibility;

THAT it add that such a privilege is not a given, even after 150 years, and that all must remain vigilant to defend against political interference, as Premier Maurice Duplessis did during the "Grande noirceur" era;

THAT, lastly, it recall the importance of a strong and independent press in exercising democracy.

THAT it affirm the essential nature not only of educators, but of all early childhood workers, and the urgent need to give them the recognition they deserve;

THAT it recognize that there will be a shortage of over 17,000 early childhood educators in the network in the coming years;

THAT it recognize that the sustainability of the network and the development of new reduced-contribution spaces are in jeopardy due to the shortage of early childhood educators;

THAT it also recall the key role of specialized educators in the support and development of children with special needs, and that it express its concern that it will see their exodus if they are not fairly compensated;

THAT it demand that the Québec government grant massive salary adjustments to early childhood workers.

Passage in Principle

Mr. Caire, Minister for Government Digital Transformation, informed the Assembly that the Honourable J. Michel Doyon, Lieutenant-Governor of Québec, recommended Bill 6, An Act to enact the Act respecting the Ministère de la Cybersécurité et du Numérique and to amend other provisions. Then, in accordance with the motion carried during this sitting, he moved that this bill do now pass in principle.

A debate arose thereon.

Ms. Soucy, Second Vice-President, interrupted the debate to inform the Assembly that she had received a request for a debate upon adjournment to be held on Thursday, 11 November 2021 on a question by Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent) to Mr. Roberge, Minister of Education, about lead testing carried out at water supply points in schools.

The debate continued on the motion moved by Mr. Caire, Minister for Government Digital Transformation.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion; at 11:49 a.m., in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 14 September 2021, Ms. Soucy, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for no longer than 10 minutes so that a recorded division could be held.

Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition

Ms. Anglade, Leader of the Official Opposition, moved:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge that the public health emergency was declared on 13 March 2020 and that since then it has been renewed repeatedly, exclusively by decree;

THAT, pursuant to section 122 of the *Public Health Act*, the National Assembly disallow the renewal of the public health emergency and demand that the CAQ government urgently table all transitional measures required to maintain public health.

Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 10 minutes to the mover of the motion for her reply; 51 minutes 15 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 31 minutes 27 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 11 minutes 39 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 8 minutes 9 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 7 minutes 30 seconds to the independent Members, subject to a maximum of 2 minutes each. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.

A debate arose thereon.

At the end of his address, Mr. Arseneau, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, moved:

THAT the motion moved by the Leader of the Official Opposition be amended as follows:

By amending the second paragraph by inserting ", in collaboration with the opposition parties," after "urgently table".

The motion, as amended, would read as follows:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge that the public health emergency was declared on 13 March 2020 and that since then it has been renewed repeatedly, exclusively by decree;

THAT, pursuant to section 122 of the *Public Health Act*, the National Assembly disallow the renewal of the public health emergency and demand that the CAQ government urgently table, in collaboration with the opposition parties, all transitional measures required to maintain public health.

The debate continued on the main motion moved by Ms. Anglade, Leader of the Official Opposition, and on the amendment motion moved by Mr. Arseneau, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, subject to the permission of its author.

Pursuant to Standing Order 98.1, Ms. Anglade, Leader of the Official Opposition, accepted the amendment proposed by Mr. Arseneau, Leader of the Third Opposition Group.

The debate being concluded, the question was first put on the amendment motion moved by Mr. Arseneau, Leader of the Third Opposition Group; at 5:00 p.m., in accordance with the motion carried on 14 September 2021, Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for no longer than 10 minutes so that a recorded division could be held.

The proceedings resumed at 5:05 p.m.

A vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.
