Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Mr. Girard, Minister of Finance, moved that Bill 5, An Act to give effect to fiscal measures announced in the Budget Speech delivered on 25 March 2021 and to certain other measures, do now pass in principle.

A debate arose thereon.

Mr. Carmant, Minister for Health and Social Services, informed the Assembly that the Honourable J. Michel Doyon, Lieutenant-Governor of Québec, recommended Bill 5 for its consideration.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on the motion; at 10:26 a.m., in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 14 September 2021, Mr. Picard, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for no longer than 10 minutes so that a recorded division could be held.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

The President informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 24 November 2021 during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mr. Marissal (Rosemont).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly note that the coroner's inquest into the management of the pandemic in CHSLDs has revealed serious deficiencies, gaps and inconsistencies in the health network;

THAT it deplore the lack of comprehensive oversight, despite the various and frequent revelations in the media;

THAT it affirm that the impacts of the mismanagement of the pandemic have been felt in all sectors of society;

THAT it recognize that Quebecers and more specifically seniors and their families have suffered from the Government's improvisation and lack of professionalism;

THAT it highlight that the public has not had access to the written notices and documents that were used by the Government to make decisions, notably those issued by public health authorities;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government to immediately establish a public inquiry, under the *Act respecting public inquiry commissions*, on the management of the COVID-19 pandemic.

At the end of his address, Mr. Kelley (Jacques-Cartier) moved the following hoist motion:

THAT the motion under debate be amended by striking out the word "now" and by adding at the end thereof the words "this day 10 weeks hence".

At 4:52 p.m., Ms. Gaudreault, Third Vice-President, suspended the proceedings for a few minutes.

The proceedings resumed at 5:23 p.m.

The hoist motion was ruled in order.

Ms. Soucy, Second Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this limited debate: 56 minutes 15 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 34 minutes 31 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 12 minutes 47 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 8 minutes 57 seconds to the Third Opposition Group; and 7 minutes 30 seconds to the independent Members, subject to a maximum of 2 minutes each. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Members or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above.

The Assembly entered upon the debate on the hoist motion moved by Mr. Kelley (Jacques-Cartier).

The debate was adjourned in the name of Mr. Tanguay (Lafontaine).
