Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Nadeau-Dubois, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, together with Mr. Legault, Premier, Ms. Anglade, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Arseneau, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure) and Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), moved:

THAT the National Assembly be concerned about the current disruptions in Ontario and around certain federal border crossings;

THAT it affirm that no emergency situation currently justifies the use of special legislative measures in Québec;

THAT it ask the Canadian government to not apply the federal *Emergencies Act* in Québec;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly reiterate the importance of close collaboration between the federal government and the Québec government, in particular to ensure peace of mind and safety for citizens in the Outaouais region who are affected by the ongoing demonstrations in Ottawa and who could have to bear the brunt of any further deterioration of the situation.

The question was put on this motion; in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 1 February 2022, a vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.

Mr. Arseneau, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, together with Mr. Leduc (Hochelaga-Maisonneuve), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure) and Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), moved a motion on establishing a joint project office tasked with developing a public transit project for Montréal East; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Ms. Rouleau, Minister for Transport, moved a motion on the need for the Réseau express métropolitain de l'Est in Montréal; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), together with Mr. Roberge, Minister of Education, Ms. Labrie, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Ms. Hivon (Joliette), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure) and Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recall that the Hooked on School Days campaign is currently under way and will run until February 18;

THAT it note that according to a survey published on February 14, nearly one in three students considered dropping out of school during the pandemic;

THAT it take note that nearly half of the persons surveyed said that society was not doing enough to foster academic perseverance;

THAT it underline that 81% of people surveyed stated that they felt competent and able to achieve the academic goals they set for themselves and that a strong majority of them are optimistic about their future;

THAT it recall that it is our duty to offer these young persons conditions and an environment that foster academic success;

THAT it recall that regardless of our role in society, we can all play an important role in a student's life in helping the student to persevere at every stage of their education;

THAT it congratulate parents, who have had to juggle work and their children's distance learning, in particular parent-teachers:

THAT it underline the remarkable work of teachers, who have had to adapt their teaching methods to motivate students;

THAT it applaud the work of support personnel who have had to be creative in assisting young persons with special needs;

THAT it tip its hat to the school administrators and administrations, and their support personnel and teams for their flexibility and adaptability over the last two years;

THAT it underline the incredible contribution of organizations that provide assistance to young persons;

THAT it congratulate Québec students, who have shown resilience and perseverance day after day;

THAT, lastly, it recognize that, more than ever, academic perseverance is everyone's business during a pandemic.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

The President informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 16 February 2022 during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mr. Derraji (Nelligan).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge that the CAQ government is about to renew for the hundredth time the state of public health emergency declared on 13 March 2020;

THAT it recall that the *Public Health Act* and the declaration of a public health emergency were not designed for the context of a pandemic spanning several years;

THAT it recall that the public health emergency grants exceptional and extensive powers to the Government and that it is not desirable for the usual standards of democratic governance to be suspended for such a long period;

THAT it acknowledge that after the successive waves of the COVID-19 pandemic caused by the emergence of variants of the virus, it is impossible to accurately determine when this pandemic will end;

THAT it declare that it is necessary to end the public health emergency as soon as possible, while ensuring that the fight against the COVID-19 pandemic and the protection of Quebecers continue;

THAT, lastly, it demand that the CAQ government commit to tabling the event report provided for in section 129 of the *Public Health Act*, which is required at the end of the public health emergency, and to doing so before the end of the current parliamentary sessional period.
