Considering that we live in an era in which disinformation is increasingly prevalent;

Considering that journalistic standards require that journalists investigate the accuracy of the facts and provide impartial and balanced content;

THAT the National Assembly affirm that quality information constitutes a pillar of our democracy;

THAT it reiterate that journalists must be able to perform their work without violation of their physical or moral integrity;

THAT, lastly, it condemn the recent reprehensible acts and insults toward Québec journalists.
