The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Motions Without Notice

Ms. Maccarone (Westmount-Saint-Louis), together with Ms. Labrie, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure) and Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), moved a motion on implementing financial assistance for families who do not have a childcare space; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion), together with Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), moved a motion on imposing a temporary rent freeze for 2022; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Gaudreault (Jonquière), together with Ms. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure) and Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), moved a motion asking the Government to demand that Hydro-Québec renounce paying compensation to Énergir; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Boulet, Minister of Labour, Employment and Social Solidarity, together with Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), Ms. Dorion (Taschereau), Mr. Ouellet, House Leader of the Third Opposition Group, Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Ms. Montpetit (Maurice-Richard), moved:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge the collective actions performed by community organizations between 21 and 24 February as part of the campaign "Engagez-vous pour le communautaire";

THAT it recognize the indispensable contribution and essential work of the community sector in maintaining Québec's social and economic safety net;

THAT it recognize, in particular, the community sector's invaluable contribution and ingenuity in the fight against the COVID-19 pandemic;

THAT it highlight that the approximately 5,000 community organizations play a major role in economic and social development and with vulnerable persons;

THAT it recall that community organizations have been waiting for a government action plan since 2007 to support their sector;

THAT it note their request for increased funding and ask the Government to continue to support community organizations;

THAT, lastly, it recognize the autonomy of community organizations in carrying out their mission.

The question was put on this motion; in accordance with the motion carried by the Assembly on 1 February 2022, a vote was held in accordance with the procedure for recorded divisions.

Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

The President informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 23 February 2022, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mr. Derraji (Nelligan).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge that the public health emergency was declared on 13 March 2020 and that since then it has been renewed repeatedly by the CAQ government;

THAT it recall that section 123 of the *Public Health Act* provides that, while the public health emergency is in effect, the Government may without delay and without further formality incur such expenses and enter into such contracts as are considered necessary;

THAT it note that since 13 March 2020, by virtue of this power, the Government has entered into thousands of untendered contracts;

THAT it voice its concern that using such a power over such a long period of time exempts billions of dollars of public funds from the usual rules for awarding public contracts and opens the door to potential ethical abuse;

THAT it demand that the CAQ government end the public health emergency immediately;

THAT, lastly, it demand that the Government table the event report provided for in section 129 of the *Public Health Act* in the National Assembly by 3 May 2022, that it include the justification for all the untendered public contracts awarded under the public health emergency and that the report be studied by the competent committee of the National Assembly before the end of the current parliamentary sessional period.
