Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 11 May 2022, on the motion moved by Mr. Leitão (Robert-Baldwin) during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly note that, for many months, Quebecers, especially the most vulnerable people and young families, have been paying the price for the rapidly rising cost of living;

THAT it acknowledge that wage growth has not been enough to address the higher inflation;

THAT it recognize that Quebecers are facing difficult choices, in particular as regards food, housing and energy;

THAT, lastly, it deplore the fact that the Québec government has not allocated sufficient resources to mitigate the impact of the rising cost of living on the population and that it demand that the Government put forward new effective measures as soon as possible.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Arseneau, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, together with Mr. Derraji (Nelligan), Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure), Mr. LeBel (Rimouski) and Ms. Montpetit (Maurice-Richard), moved a motion on establishing care/patient ratios in the health network; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Boulet, Minister of Immigration, Francization and Integration, together with Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion), Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure) and Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), moved:

THAT the National Assembly ask the federal government to establish efficient mechanisms for transferring asylum seekers to other provinces in order to take into account Québec's asylum reception capacity; THAT it demand that the Government of Canada significantly reduce the time required to process asylum applications and issue work permits in order to facilitate the rapid integration of these individuals;

THAT, lastly, it ask the federal government to speed up negotiations under way with the United States to update the Safe Third Country Agreement so that asylum seekers can enter Québec through regular ports of entry.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), together with Ms. Labrie, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Ms. Hivon (Joliette), Mr. Ouellette (Chomedey), Mr. Roy (Bonaventure) and Mr. LeBel (Rimouski), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark Quebec Family Week, held this year under the theme "Stepping Up for Families";

THAT it recall that the purpose of this week is to recognize the place of families in Québec public policy;

THAT it remind the Government of the importance of taking action to create a more harmonious balance between work and home and undertake to promote that balance;

THAT it invite the population as a whole to be open to the diversity of families' realities and to be aware that their needs are constantly evolving;

THAT it ask the Government to recognize that the financial burden on families must be shared collectively, through public programs and policies that are responsive to their needs, fair and equitable;

THAT it commit to supporting informal caregivers in a way that is worthy of their invaluable contributions;

THAT it recall that Québec must set an example in providing support to families, guided by the core values of mutual assistance, equity and goodwill;

THAT it invite the citizens and Government of Québec to commit to stepping up for families and thus contribute to building the Québec of tomorrow.

The question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.
