# **Oral Questions and Answers**

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

#### **Motions Without Notice**

Mr. Morin (Acadie), together with Ms. Labrie (Sherbrooke) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on the labour shortage in the legal sector; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), together with Ms. D'Amours (Mirabel) and Ms. Garceau (Robert-Baldwin), moved:

THAT the National Assembly unite in condemning the violent repression of protests and the human rights abuses committed by Iran's theocratic regime against its population since the death of the young Kurdish woman Mahsa Amini;

THAT it affirm its full solidarity with the Iranian women who are taking part in a true feminist and democratic revolution by taking to the streets without hijabs, at the risk of their lives, to defend their rights and those of future generations;

THAT it also recognize the many Iranian men who have stood in solidarity with their fellow citizens, breaking with the gender antagonism that the regime has sought to make the foundation of Iran's social order;

THAT it affirm its full solidarity with our brothers and sisters of the Iranian diaspora in Québec, who are strongly speaking up for their loved ones in Iran so that their fundamental and democratic rights may one day be respected;

THAT it strongly condemn the murder of children committed by the Iranian regime, the use of torture in Iranian prisons and the sentencing to death of arbitrarily imprisoned protestors;

THAT the National Assembly call on the authorities of the Islamic Republic of Iran to fully cooperate with the independent, international fact-finding mission that will investigate the alleged human rights violations in the wake of the popular uprisings following the death of Mahsa Amini;

THAT the National Assembly call for the removal of the Islamic Republic of Iran from the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the question was put on this motion; a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Charette, Minister of the Environment, the Fight Against Climate Change, Wildlife and Parks, together with Ms. McGraw (Notre-Dame-de-Grâce), Ms. Zaga Mendez (Verdun) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Chair of the Advisory Committee on Climate Change, the Ouronos Consortium on Regional Climatology and Adaptation to Climate Change and Québec's Chief Scientist to organize, as soon as possible, transpartisan climate change training for the Members.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 53, the Assembly proceeded to Introduction of Bills.

#### **Introduction of Bills**

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 185 and 232, Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Government House Leader and Minister of Justice, together with Mr. Tanguay, Leader of the Official Opposition, and Mr. Leduc, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, moved that leave be granted to introduce the following bill:

An Act to ratify the Agreement relating to the concept of parliamentary group, to the conduct of proceedings in the Assembly and in parliamentary committees, to budgetary aspects and to other measures promoting work-family balance

The motion was carried.

Accordingly, Bill 5 was introduced in the Assembly.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 54, the Assembly proceeded to the consideration of a bill.

#### **Joint Bills**

Passage in Principle

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 185 and 236, Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Government House Leader and Minister of Justice, Mr. Tanguay, Leader of the Official Opposition, and Mr. Leduc, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, moved that Bill 5, An Act to ratify the Agreement relating to the concept of parliamentary group, to the conduct of proceedings in the Assembly and in parliamentary committees, to budgetary aspects and to other measures promoting work-family balance, do now pass in principle.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 239, the question on this motion was put without debate.

The motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 5 was passed in principle.

Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Government House Leader, moved that Bill 5 be referred to the Committee of the Whole for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Government House Leader, moved that the Assembly resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole for the clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 5, An Act to ratify the Agreement relating to the concept of parliamentary group, to the conduct of proceedings in the Assembly and in parliamentary committees, to budgetary aspects and to other measures promoting work-family balance.

The motion was carried.

Committee of the Whole

Bill 5 was considered in the Committee of the Whole and thereupon reported.

The report was concurred in.

Passage

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Orders 22, 185 and 230, Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Government House Leader and Minister of Justice, Mr. Tanguay, Leader of the Official Opposition, and Mr. Leduc, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, moved the passage of Bill 5, An Act to ratify the Agreement relating to the concept of parliamentary group, to the conduct of proceedings in the Assembly and in parliamentary committees, to budgetary aspects and to other measures promoting work-family balance.

The motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 5 was passed.

Opening Speech Debate

At the end of his address, Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage) moved the following motion stating a grievance:

THAT the National Assembly deplore the Government's lack of love for its own people and urge it to restore hope, audacity and our dreams of collective freedom.

The debate continued on the Opening Speech of the Session, on the motion moved by Mr. Legault, Premier, and on the motions stating a grievance moved by Mr. Tanguay, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), Mr. Beauchemin (Marguerite-Bourgeoys), Ms. Dufour (Mille-Îles) and Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage), subject to the receivability of these motions.
