#### **Motions Without Notice**

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Ghazal, Whip of the Second Opposition Group, together with Mr. Bonnardel, Minister of Public Security, Ms. Garceau (Robert-Baldwin) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that cyberviolence is not a virtual phenomenon and that it has serious and real impacts on the lives of women who speak publicly and on social media:

THAT it take note that according to a report by the UN Broadband Commission for Digital Development, women are 27 times more likely than men to be harassed online;

THAT it also take note that in 2020, according to a global study by The Economist Intelligence Unit, 85% of women using social media have experienced some form of online violence;

THAT it recognize that the web giants' lack of regulation creates a climate of insecurity and fear for women, with the aim of silencing them;

THAT it ask the Government to intensify efforts to train and raise awareness among Québec police officers with regard to cyberviolence and cyberharassment; THAT it ask the federal government to implement concrete measures to force social media to remove "hateful" and "criminal" content;

THAT it ask the Government to analyze and, where applicable, put in place all relevant measures to combat this phenomenon, and to do so in collaboration with the opposition groups;

THAT the National Assembly therefore undertake to use all means at its disposal to fight cyberviolence in order to protect women's freedom of expression and their sense of security.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Déry, Minister of Higher Education, together with Mr. Tanguay, Leader of the Official Opposition, Ms. Ghazal, Whip of the Second Opposition Group, and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly honour the memory of the 14 women who, for no reason other than the fact that they were women, lost their lives in the tragic Polytechnique massacre of 6 December 1989;

THAT it unite in condemning all forms of violence against women and that it encourage all Quebecers to strongly denounce such violence;

THAT it recall that Québec is a society that defends equality between men and women and that everyone must work daily towards this equality;

THAT the National Assembly observe a minute of silence in memory of the victims.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

At the request of the President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.
