Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred on 1 February 2023, on the motion moved by Mr. Fortin (Pontiac) during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly take note that as the CAQ government begins its 5th year in office, Québec is experiencing an unacceptable deterioration in its wait times for access to primary care;

THAT it note that under the CAQ government:

- the average time spent on a stretcher has more than doubled in the last 4 years, from 14.2 hours to 29.31 hours:
- 163,991 patients are waiting for surgery, 20,649 of whom have been waiting for more than 12 months;
- another 608 cancer patients are waiting for surgery, despite the Minister of Health's commitments to reduce delays;
- vacancies for orderlies in the health network have risen from 2,700 in 2020 to 4,200 in 2022, and vacancies for nurses have risen from 4,300 to more than 5,000 over the same period;

THAT it recall that the Government wishes to be judged on its results and that these results show a major setback in access to health care in Québec;

THAT, lastly, it ask the CAQ government to commit to making the necessary adjustments and to respond to the fundamental mission of the State, which is to offer quality care and services in a timely manner to all Quebecers.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), together with Mr. Lacombe, Minister of Culture and Communications, Ms. Setlakwe (Mont-Royal–Outremont), Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize the unique work of author and illustrator Elise Gravel who, through her work, has enabled young readers from all over the world to better understand the concepts of inclusion, tolerance and respect for sexual orientation and gender diversity;

THAT it highlight the great talent, sense of humour and sensitivity of this author who has received numerous awards and who is an internationally renowned artist Quebecers can be very proud of;

THAT the National Assembly condemn the fact that some of Ms. Gravel's books dealing with issues of inclusion and diversity have been censored in several American schools;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly acknowledge that this censorship is unacceptable and has no place in the arts or in democracy.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) moved a motion on closing Roxham Road; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Legault, Premier, together with Mr. Tanguay, Leader of the Official Opposition, Mr. Nadeau-Dubois, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 75th anniversary of the Québec Fleurdelisé flag, an emblem of our distinct character and of our history;

THAT it invite all Quebecers to celebrate this powerful symbol of our pride in being the people of Québec, in our French language, in our desire to flourish while maintaining our own unique characteristics, and in our determination to decide how we want to evolve as a nation.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried.

Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent), together with Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on the increase in school violence in Québec schools; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.
