Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion), together with Mr. Derraji, Official Opposition House Leader, and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that the journey undertaken by asylum seekers and the conditions in which they are received look nothing like an all-inclusive vacation;

THAT it reiterate the urgent need to renegotiate the Safe Third Country Agreement;

THAT it ask the federal government to take steps to ensure all Canadian provinces and territories assume fair responsibility in the reception of asylum seekers.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, together with Mr. Roberge, Minister Responsible for Canadian Relations and the Canadian Francophonie, Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recall that the Canadian government's contribution to health services funding has decreased considerably over the years, as it once represented 50% but is now called on to fund only 24% of costs;

THAT it affirm that the Canadian government's most recent offer is clearly insufficient to ensure the sustainability of health services for the population and that Quebecers will therefore have to assume the cost of this shortfall; otherwise, they will have to endure a decrease in health services;

THAT it denounce the inadequacy of Canada's offer and its definitive nature and the Canadian government's gradual withdrawal from the health of Ouebecers;

THAT, lastly, it reiterate that the current Canadian framework and its fiscal imbalance places Québec in a difficult situation from a financial standpoint.

The question was put on this motion, and a record division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Lacombe, Minister of Culture and Communications, together with Ms. Setlakwe (Mont-Royal–Outremont), Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly acknowledge that the federal government could soon pass Bill C-11, which aims to amend the Broadcasting Act;

THAT it underline that this bill does not recognize the application of Québec laws regarding the status of artists;

THAT it recognize that this bill, as it is currently written, grants Québec no rights of inspection on the directions that will be given to the CRTC, and that those directions will have a significant impact on Québec's cultural community;

THAT it remind the federal government that Québec's linguistic specificity must be respected;

THAT it highlight for the federal government that as a nation, it is up to Ouébec to define its cultural orientations;

THAT it demand that Québec be officially consulted on the directions that will be given to the CRTC regarding the bill and that, for this purpose, a formal mechanism be added to the bill;

THAT it affirm that Québec will continue to apply, in its areas of jurisdiction, the laws democratically passed by the National Assembly;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly inform the federal parliament that Québec will use all the tools at its disposal to continue protecting its language, culture and identity.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Tanguay, Leader of the Official Opposition, together with Mr. Legault, Premier, Ms. Massé (Sainte-Marie–Saint-Jacques), Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly express its profound sadness regarding the deadly tragedy which occurred at the Garderie éducative Ste-Rose on 8 February, 2023;

THAT it honour the memory of the two young victims who lost their lives and that it extend its sincere condolences to their bereaved families:

THAT it express its full solidarity with the injured children, the families of the victims, the educators and other employees, the first responders as well as the entire community of Laval affected by this tragedy;

THAT, lastly, it observe a minute of silence in memory of the victims and their families.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

At the request of Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 15 February 2023, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly note that increases in rent in all Québec municipalities far exceed the Tribunal administratif du logement's rent adjustment recommendations;

THAT it ask the Québec government to tackle the housing crisis by establishing mandatory rent control for all rental property leases:

THAT it ask that this rent control include eliminating the exception contained in Section F of the lease in order to allow the Tribunal administratif du logement to fix the rents for dwellings built or converted for rental purposes less than five years ago.
