The Assembly was called to order at 1:40 p.m.

Presenting Reports from Committees

Mr. Simard (Montmorency), Committee Chair, tabled the following:

The report from the Committee on Public Finance, which held public hearings on 8, 9 and 14 February 2023 within the framework of special consultations on the Québec Pension Plan consultation document on a plan adapted to 21st century challenges entitled "Un régime adapté aux défis du 21e siècle". The report contains observations, conclusions and three recommendations.

Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Motions Without Notice

Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), together with Ms. Labrie (Sherbrooke), Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on the end of the organization Interligne's night support service; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

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Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), together with Ms. Garceau (Robert-Baldwin), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on Collectif 8 mars and feminist struggles; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) moved a motion on Québec's reception capacity for asylum seekers; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Fitzgibbon, Minister of Economy, Innovation and Energy, together with Mr. Kelley (Jacques-Cartier), moved a motion on the assessment of Québec's hydroelectric potential; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Public Finance, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 3, An Act respecting health and social services information and amending various legislative provisions;

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Ms. Soucy, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 22 February 2023, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mr. Beauchemin (Marguerite-Bourgeoys).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly take note that the CAQ government has proposed to finance tax cuts by diverting revenue dedicated to the Generations Fund;

THAT it declare that this would have a negative impact on reducing intergenerational inequity and have a significant longterm impact in terms of potential lost revenues for the Generations Fund:

THAT it recall that reducing Québec's debt ratio will require concerted long-term efforts;

THAT it declare that any modification to the payments or operation of the Fund must first be the subject of extensive consultations with the youth of Québec;

THAT, accordingly, the Assembly ask the CAQ government to maintain the Generations Fund's capital and dedicated revenue payment deposits.

Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Ms. LeBel, Minister Responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, informed the Assembly that the Honourable J. Michel Doyon, Lieutenant-Governor of Québec, recommended Bill 9, An Act amending mainly certain Acts establishing public sector pension plans, for its consideration, and then moved that this bill do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 9 was passed in principle.

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 9 be referred to the Committee on Public Finance for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

At 3:21 p.m., at the request of Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, Ms. Soucy, First Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until the expiry of the time limit for receiving notices for debates upon adjournment.
