Motion moved by the Member for Marguerite-Bourgeoys under Standing Order 97:

THAT the National Assembly take note that the CAQ government has proposed to finance tax cuts by diverting revenue dedicated to the Generations Fund;

THAT it declare that this would have a negative impact on reducing intergenerational inequity and have a significant long-term impact in terms of potential lost revenues for the Generations Fund;

THAT it recall that reducing Québec's debt ratio will require concerted long-term efforts;

THAT it declare that any modification to the payments or operation of the Fund must first be the subject of extensive consultations with the youth of Québec;

THAT, accordingly, the Assembly ask the CAQ government to maintain the Generations Fund's capital and dedicated revenue payment deposits.
