Presenting Reports from Committees

Mr. Bachand (Richmond), Committee Chair, tabled the following:

The report from the Committee on Institutions, which met on 21 and 22 February 2023 for clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 8, An Act to improve justice efficiency and accessibility, in particular by promoting mediation and arbitration and by simplifying civil procedure in the Court of Québec. The report contains amendments to the bill.

Complaints of Breach of Privilege or Contempt and Personal Explanations

The President informed the Assembly that she had, within the prescribed time, received a request from Mr. Derraji, Official Opposition House Leader, to be heard on an alleged breach of privilege.

In his notice, the Official Opposition House Leader alleged that the Minister of Families acted in contempt of Parliament by misleading the National Assembly on 16 February 2023 by asserting three times, during Oral Questions and Answers, that 33,000 children were waiting for a childcare space.

The notice further stated the Official Opposition House Leader's intention to move a motion under Standing Orders 315 and following.

The President informed the Assembly that she would hear arguments at a later sitting.

Oral Questions and Answers

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

At the request of the President, Mr. Tanguay, Leader of the Official Opposition, thrice withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

At the request of the President, Ms. Garceau (Robert-Baldwin) withdrew certain words deemed unparliamentary.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 53, the Assembly proceeded with the tabling of a committee report.

Reports from Committees

Mr. Simard (Montmorency), Committee Chair, tabled the following:

The report from the Committee on Public Finance, which met on 22 February 2023 for clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 6, An Act to give effect to fiscal measures announced in the Budget Speech delivered on 22 March 2022 and to certain other measures. The report contains amendments to the bill.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred on 22 February 2023, on the motion moved by Mr. Beauchemin (Marguerite-Bourgeoys) during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly take note that the CAQ government has proposed to finance tax cuts by diverting revenue dedicated to the Generations Fund;

THAT it declare that this would have a negative impact on reducing intergenerational inequity and have a significant longterm impact in terms of potential lost revenues for the Generations Fund;

THAT it recall that reducing Québec's debt ratio will require concerted long-term efforts;

THAT it declare that any modification to the payments or operation of the Fund must first be the subject of extensive consultations with the youth of Québec;

THAT, accordingly, the Assembly ask the CAQ government to maintain the Generations Fund's capital and dedicated revenue payment deposits.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) moved a motion on including the Minister of Justice in the Groupe d'action pour l'avenir de la langue française; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Bonnardel, Minister of Public Security, together with Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark National Fight Against the Sexual Exploitation of Minors Week, which takes place every year from 1 to 7 March, as well as National Fight Against the Sexual Exploitation of Minors Day, which will take place on March 4th;

THAT it recognize the importance of conveying a strong message that the sexual exploitation of minors will never be tolerated in our society and that all government stakeholders, community organizations, educational institutions, citizens and businesses will continue to mobilize to combat this scourge;

THAT it reiterate that this fight remains a national priority and that the Québec government must continue to take action on multiple fronts, as stated in response to recommendations by the Select Committee on the Sexual Exploitation of Minors in the 2021–2026 government action plan entitled "Briser le cycle de l'exploitation sexuelle";

THAT it underline the transpartisan work of Members in this regard during the previous legislature;

THAT it recognize and applaud the work of stakeholders in the field, particularly that of the community organizations that complement government actions in order to help victims of sexual exploitation and their families.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mr. Derraji, Official Opposition House Leader, together with Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage), Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on political neutrality in the public service; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), together with Mr. Legault, Premier, Ms. Setlakwe (Mont-Royal—Outremont), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly reaffirm the inalienable right of the people of Ukraine to their territorial integrity;

THAT it declare that Russia's armed invasion of Ukraine violates international law, in particular its military attacks on the civilian population and essential infrastructure;

THAT, like the House of Commons of Canada, it denounce the genocidal acts committed against the Ukrainian people that have been reported by the media;

THAT it welcome to Québec all temporarily displaced Ukrainians, while asking the governments of Québec and Canada to do everything in their power to facilitate their arrival in the country;

THAT it reaffirm its long-standing friendly relations with the Ukrainian diaspora in Québec;

THAT it applaud the heroic resistance of the Ukrainian people and the courage of those supporting the anti-war movement in Russia:

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly observe a minute of silence in memory of the victims.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

At the request of Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, the Assembly observed a minute of silence.

Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), together with Mr. Fortin (Pontiac), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), moved a motion on ambulance services; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Notices of Proceedings in Committees

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committee:

 the Committee on Public Finance, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 3, An Act respecting health and social services information and amending various legislative provisions.

Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, gave the following notices:

- the Committee on Culture and Education shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the possibility of carrying out an order of initiative on the increase in violence in and around schools;
- the Committee on Citizen Relations shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the possibility of carrying out an order of initiative on closures and conversions of private seniors' residences (RPA).

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Friday, 17 March 2023, Ms. Zaga Mendez (Verdun) would question Ms. Blanchette Vézina, Minister of Natural Resources and Forests, during an interpellation on the importance of a new social contract for mining in response to the explosion in the number of claims in southern Québec.

Debates on Reports from Committees

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Public Finance, which held public hearings on 8, 9 and 14 February 2023 within the framework of special consultations on the Québec Pension Plan consultation document on a plan adapted to 21st century challenges entitled "Un régime adapté aux défis du 21e siècle". The report contains observations, a conclusion and three recommendations.

Mr. Benjamin, Third Vice-President, informed the Assembly of the allocation of speaking time for the proceedings with respect to this debate: 60 minutes to the parliamentary group forming the Government; 32 minutes 42 seconds to the parliamentary group forming the Official Opposition; 19 minutes 48 seconds to the Second Opposition Group; 6 minutes to the Third Opposition Group; and 1 minute 30 seconds to the independent Member. Within this framework, any time not used by the independent Member or by a parliamentary group shall be redistributed among the parliamentary groups in the proportions established above. Lastly, individual addresses shall not be limited.
