#### **Motions Without Notice**

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Roberge, Minister of the French Language, together with Ms. Setlakwe (Mont-Royal–Outremont), Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine), Ms. Tardif (Laviolette–Saint-Maurice) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark not only the Journée québécoise de la francophonie canadienne, but also International Francophonie Day;

THAT it recall the leading role Québec plays in the French-speaking world while respecting the diversity of francophone and Acadian communities and other governments;

THAT it reaffirm that it supports the francophone and Acadian communities because of the long history that unites them with the Québec nation and the fact that Québec is the only French-speaking State in North America;

THAT it reiterate that defending the French language in Québec is the responsibility of all generations of Quebecers;

THAT, lastly, it underline the commitment of all Québec government subsectors to promote the French language and the growth of francophone and Acadian communities.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Ms. McGraw (Notre-Dame-de-Grâce), together with Mr. Nadeau-Dubois, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on the amounts invested in greenhouse gas reduction; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

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By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Labrie (Sherbrooke), together with Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister of Justice, Ms. Garceau (Robert-Baldwin), Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, Ms. Tardif (Laviolette–Saint-Maurice) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that domestic violence includes psychological, verbal, physical, sexual and economic abuse:

THAT it underline that domestic violence has significant impacts on its victims;

THAT it underline that the *Criminal Code* does not make it possible to take into account certain forms of domestic violence and the considerable harm they cause, because no offence includes all aspects of coercive control;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly ask the federal government to create an expert federal-provincial-territorial working group tasked with making recommendations on the drafting of legislation to add a coercive and controlling behaviour offence in the *Criminal Code*, as recommended in the report of the House of Commons of Canada's Standing Committee on Justice and Human Rights.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, together with Mr. Zanetti (Jean-Lesage), moved a motion on implementing a single, pre-completed income tax return; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

#### **Notices of Proceedings in Committees**

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 143, Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, convened the following committees:

- the Committee on Institutions, to undertake public hearings within the framework of special consultations on Bill 12, An Act to reform family law with regard to filiation and to protect children born as a result of sexual assault and the victims of that assault as well as the rights of surrogates and of children born of a surrogacy project;
- the Committee on Health and Social Services, to continue its clause-byclause consideration of Bill 10, An Act limiting the use of personnel placement agencies' services and independent labour in the health and social services sector.

Mr. Lévesque, Second Vice-President, gave the following notices:

 the Committee on Culture and Education shall hold a public meeting to continue its public hearings within the framework of special consultations on the order of initiative on the revelations of violence during hazing in the junior hockey league and the potential situation in other sports;

- the Committee on Agriculture, Fisheries, Energy and Natural Resources shall hold deliberative meetings to discuss the possibility of carrying out an order of initiative to hear the person who will be the next President and Chief Executive Officer of Hydro-Québec and to discuss the possibility of carrying out an order of initiative on the increase in the cost of food in Québec;
- the Committee on Labour and the Economy shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the possibility of carrying out an order of initiative on remote monitoring software.
