THAT the National Assembly censure the CAQ government for the weakness of its orthodox stance on the Canadian Constitution, which prevents the Québec peoples from achieving their dreams of freedom.

## The Member for Mille-Îles:

THAT the National Assembly severely censure the CAQ government for tabling a budget that does not help Québec families find housing, meet the expectations of housing organizations or support cities and municipalities to address their urgent and growing needs.

The Île-aux-Tourtes bridge is an important piece of road infrastructure used by no less than 87,000 vehicles every day. This piece of infrastructure, which came into service in 1965, has now fallen into disrepair.
