Government Bills

Passage in Principle

Ms. Bélanger, Minister for Health and for Seniors, moved that Bill 11, An Act to amend the Act respecting end-of-life care and other legislative provisions, do now pass in principle.

A debate arose thereon.

Pursuant to Standing Order 100, Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, moved the adjournment of the debate.

The motion was carried.

Accordingly, the debate on the motion moved by Ms. Bélanger, Minister for Health and for Seniors, was adjourned.

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Public Finance on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 9, An Act amending mainly certain Acts establishing public sector pension plans.

After debate thereon, the report was concurred in.

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Passage

Mr. Fitzgibbon, Minister of Economy, Innovation and Energy, moved the passage of Bill 13, An Act respecting the Hertel-New York interconnection line.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 13 was passed.

The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Prass (D'Arcy-McGee), together with Mr. Carmant, Minister Responsible for Social Services, Ms. Massé (Sainte-Marie-Saint-Jacques), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark the 39th anniversary of Autism Month, whose theme this year is "Let's make autism shine in all its diversity";

THAT it recall that raising public awareness is important work that must be supported every day to overcome prejudices;

THAT it recall that a person with autism has the same rights as everyone else and that their difference is an asset for our society, not a constraint;

THAT it recognize that the needs of people with autism and their families are significant, and that it is important to be mobilized all year long to support them;

THAT it recognize the importance of taking action, given that in Québec, approximately 1 in 68 children are diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder each year;

THAT it ask the Government to continue investing to meet their immediate needs;

THAT, lastly, it ask the Government to serve as a role model of inclusion and active participation for autistic people in our society.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Nadeau-Dubois, Leader of the Second Opposition Group, together with Ms. Biron, Minister Responsible for the Status of Women, Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly underline that drag queens should not, under any circumstances, have to endure violent insults, intolerance and hatred for their participation in storytelling activities for children;

THAT it recognize that exposing children to differences helps make Québec a model of equality and equity for gender plural communities all over the world;

THAT it deplore the rise of hateful and discriminatory comments towards members of the LGBTQI2S+ community in Québec's public sphere.

The question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, together with Mr. Beauchemin (Marguerite-Bourgeoys), Mr. Bouazzi (Maurice-Richard) and Ms.Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on reimbursing the amounts overbilled by Hydro-Québec between 2005 and 2017; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Dubé, Minister of Health, together with Mr. Fortin (Pontiac), Mr. Marissal (Rosemont), Mr. Arseneau (Îlesde-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly take note that approximately two Quebecers out of five will be diagnosed with cancer in their lifetime;

THAT it recognize that many Quebecers are directly affected by cancer and that they stand in solidarity with those who are experiencing or have experienced this disease;

THAT it underline that the Daffodil Campaign raises funds for research projects that will change the future of the fight against cancer and helps develop a support network to improve the lives of people with cancer;

THAT it acknowledge that the daffodil is a symbol of strength, courage and life for people with cancer, and that it brings communities together by encouraging them to volunteer with and donate to the Canadian Cancer Society;

THAT the National Assembly of Québec encourage all Quebecers to take concrete actions during the Canadian Cancer Society's Daffodil Campaign to help people affected by cancer;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly of Québec mark the month of April as Daffodil Month for Cancer Awareness.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

- the Committee on Health and Social Services shall hold a deliberative meeting to discuss the possibility of examining a petition on increasing financial compensation for family-type resources for adults to counter inflation.

Information on the Proceedings of the Assembly

Ms. Soucy, First Vice-President, informed the Assembly that on Wednesday, 5 April 2023, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition, a debate would be held on the motion moved by Mr. Marissal (Rosemont).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that the fundamental mission of local community service centres (CLSCs) includes the provision of services to the local population based on their needs in their living environment, at school, at work or at home;

THAT the National Assembly ask the Government to maintain the entirety of the current mission of CLSCs in Bill 15, in particular the populational responsibility.
