The Assembly proceeded to Oral Question Period.

Motions Without Notice

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Blanchette Vézina, Minister of Natural Resources and Forests, together with Mr. Kelley (Jacques-Cartier) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly reaffirm that natural resources are under Québec's jurisdiction;

THAT it recall that Québec is pioneering and innovative with its Plan for the Development of Critical and Strategic Minerals, also called the minerals of the future;

THAT it underline that Québec's standards are among the highest internationally, allowing mineral traceability that is recognized abroad and that gives Québec a comparative advantage;

THAT it underline that Québec has achieved international recognition for improving its best practices by raising its environmental, social and governance standards;

THAT it reiterate that mining development is necessary for the energy transition and to decarbonize our economy;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly ask the Government to continue improving its best practices in mining regulation, based on conclusive data and scientific consensus regarding the environmental and social impacts of these practices, while consulting the population and allowing citizens to participate.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent), together with Mr. Grandmont (Taschereau), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly remind the CAQ government that decisions regarding infrastructure projects must be based on demonstrated needs, conclusive data and high-quality studies while respecting all the criteria governing the various infrastructure programs.

The question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Labrie (Sherbrooke), together with Ms. Caron (La Pinière), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly recognize that more than 500 private seniors' residences (RPA) in Québec have closed in the last five years;

THAT it acknowledge that many RPAs are facing profitability and labour shortage issues;

THAT it denounce the fact that certain real estate developers are converting or closing down RPAs at the expense of seniors' quality of life;

THAT it recognize the urgency of the situation and note that the instability imposed on seniors affects their mental and physical health;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly ask the Government to financially support the development of non-profit seniors' residences in order to prepare Québec for the aging of the population.

The question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.
