Appropriation Bills

By leave of the Assembly, Ms. LeBel, Minister Responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor, moved the introduction, passage in principle and passage of Bill 21, Appropriation Act No. 2, 2023–2024.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Yeas: 75 Nays: 31 Abstentions: 0

Accordingly, Bill 21, Appropriation Act No. 2, 2023–2024, was passed.

Deferred Divisions

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 10 May 2023, on the motion moved by Mr. Tanguay, Leader of the Official Opposition, and on the amendment motion moved by Mr. Grandmont (Taschereau) during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

First, the question was put on the amendment motion moved by Mr. Grandmont (Taschereau).

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the motion moved by the Leader of the Official Opposition be amended as follows:

By adding the following paragraph after the second paragraph:

"THAT, lastly, it denounce the CAQ government's lack of transparency, in having refused to disclose the study for a third link involving various scenarios, including one that reserved it exclusively for public transit, to Quebecers before the October 2022 election campaign."

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

Yeas: 31 Nays: 74 Abstentions: 0

The question was then put on the motion moved by Mr. Tanguay, Leader of the Official Opposition.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly note that the Coalition avenir Québec government has repeatedly broken its promises;

THAT it acknowledge that the most recent example of this is the Government's backtracking on the Québec City-Lévis highway tunnel.

The motion was negatived on the following vote:

Motions Without Notice

Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), together with Mr. Roberge, Minister of the French Language, and Mr. Cliche-Rivard (Saint-Henri–Sainte-Anne), moved a motion on Québec's immigration powers; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Mr. Bonnardel, Minister of Public Security, together with Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion), Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark National Police Week, held from 14 to 20 May 2023, and Police Appreciation Day, held on 15 May 2023;

THAT it recognize the fundamental work carried out by police officers to ensure the population's sense of security;

THAT it remember those who sacrificed their lives to protect Quebecers;

THAT it thank all police officers who show their bravery every day in order to ensure the protection of the public;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly reiterate its unwavering support for Québec police officers.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis), together with Ms. Biron, Minister of International Relations and La Francophonie, Mr. Fontecilla (Laurier-Dorion), Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly mark International Day Against Homophobia and Transphobia, held on 17 May 2023, under the theme "LGBTQ phobias are irrational fears";

THAT it declare its solidarity with the fight for the rights of the people belonging to the 2SLGBTQIA+ community, rights which have not been acquired around the world;

THAT it acknowledge the violence and discrimination experienced by the people in the 2SLGBTQIA+ community;

THAT it recognize the importance of building a Québec that is always more inclusive, open and imbued with solidarity and goodwill towards the members of the 2SLGBTQIA+ community, in particular by stepping up awareness-raising efforts;

THAT the National Assembly recognize that phobias such as homophobia, transphobia, lesbophobia and biphobia harm 2SLGBTQIA+ communities;

THAT it recognize the importance of education in the recognition of sexual diversity as well as the plurality of identities and gender expressions;

THAT it recall that the International Day Against Homophobia and Transphobia is an initiative of the Québec organization Fondation Émergence and that this day represents a vehicle for change in many countries;

THAT the National Assembly support the official recognition, by the United Nations and its member states, of 17 May as International Day Against Homophobia and Transphobia.

By leave of the Assembly, a debate arose thereon.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried.

By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Ghazal (Mercier) moved:

THAT the National Assembly reaffirm Québec's unwavering support for negotiations between the two parties to find a political, fair and peaceful solution to the current conflict;

THAT it voice its concern for the vulnerable populations and the civilians affected by this conflict;

THAT it also call for respect of the fundamental rights and freedoms of all citizens of the Palestinian territories and Israel;

THAT the National Assembly recall Palestinians' right to self-determination and the creation of a viable state and the right of the State of Israel to live in peace and security through a two-state solution.

By leave of the Assembly, the motion was carried.

- the Committee on Institutions, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 12, An Act to reform family law with regard to filiation and to protect children born as a result of sexual assault and the victims of that assault as well as the rights of surrogates and of children born of a surrogacy project;
- the Committee on Institutions, to continue its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 14, An Act to amend various provisions relating to public security and to enact the Act to assist in locating missing persons;
- the Committee on Planning and the Public Domain, to undertake clauseby-clause consideration of Bill 16, An Act to amend the Act respecting land use planning and development and other provisions.
