#### **Deferred Divisions**

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 24 May 2023, on the motion moved by Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, as amended, during Business Standing in the Name of Members in Opposition.

This motion reads as follows:

THAT the National Assembly ask the Chief Electoral Officer of Québec to disclose and make public all the Grenier Commission testimonies and documents as soon as possible.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

The Assembly took the division, which had been deferred at the sitting of 24 May 2023, on the motion moved by Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Government House Leader and Minister of Justice, that Bill 24, An Act to follow up on the recommendations of the report of the Comité consultatif indépendant sur la révision de l'indemnité annuelle des membres de l'Assemblée nationale, do pass in principle.

The motion was carried on the following vote:

Yeas: 90 Nays: 13 Abstentions: 0

Accordingly, Bill 24 was passed in principle.

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 24 be referred to the Committee on Institutions for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

#### **Motions Without Notice**

Mr. Leduc, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, together with Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, moved a motion on the public expenses incurred by the institution of the Canadian monarchy; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), together with Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), moved a motion on a document of the Observatoire québécois des inégalités regarding equal opportunities in education entitled "Bulletin de l'égalité des chances en éducation"; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

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By leave of the Assembly to set aside Standing Order 185, Ms. Déry, Minister of Higher Education, together with Ms. Cadet (Bourassa-Sauvé), Mr. Leduc, House Leader of the Second Opposition Group, Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved:

THAT the National Assembly applaud the leadership displayed by Acfas in its capacity to bring together and represent French-speaking researchers so that they can fully participate in the development and enrichment of Québec society;

THAT it recall the key role played by Acfas in promoting French-language research throughout the Québec, Canadian and international Francophonie;

THAT it acknowledge the recognition Acfas has acquired within the international scientific Francophonie since its founding by Brother Marie-Victorin, radiologist Léo Pariseau and botanist Jacques Rousseau on 15 June 1923, in Montréal;

THAT, lastly, the National Assembly pay tribute to Acfas for its 100 years of exceptional contributions to the promotion and advancement of the research community and the transfer of knowledge in French.

The question was put on this motion, and a recorded division was thereupon demanded.

THAT the Minister Responsible for Government Administration and Chair of the Conseil du trésor be a member of the said Committee during its proceedings with respect to this order of reference.

#### **Government Bills**

Passage in Principle

The Assembly resumed the debate, which had been adjourned on 24 May 2023, on the motion moved by Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister of Justice, that Bill 26, An Act to amend the Courts of Justice Act to, in particular, give effect to the agreement between the chief judge of the Court of Québec and the Minister of Justice, do now pass in principle.

The debate being concluded, the motion was carried on division and Bill 26 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 26 be referred to the Committee on Institutions for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

Mr. Charette, Minister of the Environment, the Fight Against Climate Change, Wildlife and Parks, informed the Assembly that the Honourable J. Michel Doyon, Lieutenant-Governor of Québec, recommended Bill 20, An Act to establish the Blue Fund and to amend other provisions, for its consideration, and then moved that this bill do now pass in principle.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and Bill 20 was accordingly passed in principle.

Mr. Lévesque, Deputy Government House Leader, moved that Bill 20 be referred to the Committee on Transportation and the Environment for clause-by-clause consideration.

The motion was carried.

## **Debates upon Adjournment**

At 1:01 p.m., the Assembly held a debate upon adjournment on a question from Mr. Morin (Acadie) to Mr. Jolin-Barrette, Minister of Justice, about the issues in the process to appoint judges.

At 1:17 p.m., Mr. Lévesque, Second Vice-President, suspended the proceedings until 2:30 p.m.

The proceedings resumed at 2:30 p.m.

#### **Government Bills**

Passage in Principle

Mr. Dubé, Minister of Health, informed the Assembly that the Honourable J. Michel Doyon, Lieutenant-Governor of Québec, recommended Bill 15, An Act to make the health and social services system more effective, for its consideration, and then moved that this bill do now pass in principle.

A debate arose thereon.

The debate was adjourned in the name of Mr. Marissal (Rosemont).
