Deferred Divisions

Motions Without Notice

Ms. Dufour (Mille-Îles), together with Ms. Zaga Mendez (Verdun) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on the modernization of selective collection; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Ms. Ghazal (Mercier), together with Ms. Rizqy (Saint-Laurent) and Mr. Bérubé (Matane-Matapédia), moved a motion on the structure of the education system; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

Mr. St-Pierre Plamondon, Leader of the Third Opposition Group, together with Mr. Kelley (Jacques-Cartier), Mr. Bouazzi (Maurice-Richard) and Ms. Nichols (Vaudreuil), moved a motion on opening up the market of hydroelectricity to the private sector; this motion could not be debated for want of unanimous consent.

THAT it recall that more than one million Quebecers live with disabilities:

THAT it emphasize the importance of continuing to work towards the elimination of barriers that limit the full integration and social participation of people with disabilities, particularly with regard to employment accessibility;

THAT, lastly, it underscore our collective duty to build a more inclusive Québec, where people with disabilities, irrespective of their disability, are fully integrated, respected and valued.

At the request of Mr. Caire, Deputy Government House Leader, the divisions on the amendment and on the report from the Committee on Institutions were deferred until Routine Proceedings on the next sitting day.

Passage

Mr. Boulet, Minister of Labour, moved the passage of Bill 19, An Act respecting the regulation of work by children.

After debate thereon, the motion was carried and, accordingly, Bill 19 was passed.

Report Stage

The Assembly took into consideration the report from the Committee on Citizen Relations on its clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 11, An Act to amend the Act respecting end-of-life care and other legislative provisions, together with the amendments transmitted by Ms. Maccarone (Westmount–Saint-Louis) and Mr. Arseneau (Îles-de-la-Madeleine).

After debate thereon, by leave of the Assembly, Ms. Soucy, First Vice-President, put the question on the amendments and on the reading thereof.
